DETAILS


This program offers full-tuition scholarships for Strayer University undergraduate programs in accounting, business administration, criminal justice or information technology.

Students in the program will:

- Receive invitations to networking events with Strayer University leadership, community leaders and other members of the Fellows for Justice Program
- Collaborate with other awardees on a project to address aspects of social justice, in partnership with a community-based organization
- Have access to professional coaching and development opportunities and peer-to-peer engagement

Eligibility requirements:

- Meet all Strayer University admission requirements
- Live in or around one of the following metropolitan areas:
 - Atlanta, GA
 - Charlotte, NC
 - Minneapolis/St. Paul, MN
 - Philadelphia, PA
 - DMV (Washington D.C., Maryland, Virginia)
- Be a high school graduate or equivalent
- Be a first-time bachelor's degree students
- Be available to start the program summer quarter,
