Such risks and uncertainties which could affect the revenues and obligations of the School District include, among others, reduced governmental allocations, changes in economic conditions, mandates from other governments, and various other events, conditions and circumstances, many of which are beyond the control of the School District. 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# **Overview of the Quarterly School Manager Report**

The Quarterly School Manager Report is a summary report on the finances and management of the School District of Philadelphia. It is prepared by the Office of Finance.

The purpose of the Quarterly School Manager Report is to provide senior management of the School District of Philadelphia with a summary of the District's progress in implementing the financial and management goals of the current fiscal year on both a "Year-to-date Actual" basis and on a "Forecast for Full Year" basis.

While the Quarterly School Manager Report focuses narrowly on the financial management of the District, it is important to keep in mind the real educational impacts to children and families of the District's financial status. Many schools lack a full array of resources and educational opportunities. Our financial plans are only effective to the extent that they provide for an adequate education of all public school children in Philadelphia.

The Quarterly School Manager Report contains the following reports and schedules:

**Operating Funds:** The Quarterly School Manager Report presents a combined presentation of revenues and expenses for the principal operating funds, in addition to detailed revenue categories in the general, intermediate unit, and debt service funds; and expenditure and current budget information divided according to the District's functional hierarchy.

The principal operating funds of the District consist of a General Fund, Intermediate Unit (IU) Fund, and a Debt Service Fund. The District is required, as a result of its covenants to holders of fixed rate bonds of the School District, to deposit funds into its sinking funds during the current fiscal year to pay some of the debt service due in the next fiscal year.

For all quarters except the fourth quarter, the operating reports present quarterly year-to-date actuals for the current fiscal year and prior two fiscal years; the current full year projection and full year actuals or latest projection for the prior two years; and the year-to-date actuals as a percentage of the total year. The fourth quarter report presents the current year amended budget, current full year projection, the current year projected budget variance, and full year obligations for the prior two years.

**Cash Flow:** The Cash Flow section includes year-to-date cash flow and vendor payment information. The School District's adopted cash flow is based on the current fiscal year's adopted budget. The cash flow projections are updated to reflect actual year-to-date results and changes to assumptions as to the timing of revenues and the payment of expense which are made as a result of actual events. The vendor payments report includes the cash payments made to date in the fiscal year to the District's vendors. The list contains payments inclusive of operating and grants expenditures.

**Personnel Reports:** The Position Summary Report contains budgeted and projected Full Time Equivalent positions and current On-Board actual employees. Budgeted and projected positions are derived from the Office of Management and Budget personnel projection system reconciled to the Staffing Management System for school-based positions. Current On-Board employees are taken from the District's Advantage HR Staffing system and include On-Board employees at months-end with status codes 1 (Active), 2 (Acting), 3 (Long-Term Substitutes), and other codes for certain employee groups. There may be instances when the Count (Filled column) is fractional which represents an employee in a part-time position. The Quarterly School Manager Report also includes a Vacancy Report which is a listing of teacher vacancies by school for operating and grant funds.

The Position Report and Vacancy Report may vary due to timing differences, different definitions of what constitutes a vacancy, and different definitions of when a vacancy is considered filled.

**Supplementary Materials:** This section of the Quarterly School Manager Report contains additional materials related to the operations of the School District.

The Debt Service Schedule is the District's current fiscal year projected operating debt service budget (net of refunding), which depicts each bond series outstanding broken down by principal and interest due in the current fiscal year. "Trapped funds<sup>1</sup>" reserved or released in the current year are shown separately.

The Capital Projects reports include a listing of the District's activities related to capital projects, in addition to detailing the monthly year-to-date cash balances for all bond funds held to pay capital projects.

The documentation also includes information regarding the school allocation methodology, major grants funds and corresponding descriptions, school-by-school Title I budgets and spend, a summary of minority and women business enterprise participation, and a listing of the data posted on the District's website as part of the Open Data Initiative.

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<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> In order to be compliant with Local Government Unit Debt Act (LGUDA) guidelines that all debt be amortized, bonds with a bullet maturity must have debt service payments set aside to pay the future principal and interest when it comes due as if there were an amortization schedule. Those funds that are set aside are considered trapped and are released when the payment is due.

#### Introduction

#### Overview

The School District of Philadelphia's Quarterly School Manager Report for the period ended June 30, 2020 represents forward-looking statements and any such statements are subject to a variety of risks and uncertainties that could cause actual results to differ materially from those that have been projected. Although the projections contained in this report are being released after the end of the fiscal year, this quarterly report is completed before the District's closing process is complete and before audited financial statements are prepared. The risks and uncertainties are also heightened given the current COVID-19 pandemic, as the full economic effects of the COVID-19 pandemic have yet to be determined.

For FY20, excluding refunding, the District currently projects operating revenues of \$3,280.1 million and operating expenditures of \$3,284.0, resulting in an operating deficit of \$(3.9) million excluding changes in reserves and an operating deficit of \$(44.1) million including changes in reserves and the net impact of refunding<sup>2</sup>. The District projects to end FY20 with a \$178.5 million positive ending fund balance.

The Q4 report reflects risk related to the long-term economic effects of COVID-19. As detailed further below and in the Operating Funds portion of this Report, the District's Q4 revenue projection reflects a significant increase in FY20 Business Use and Occupancy Tax revenue relative to the Amended Budget. This increase, however, may be offset by future credits as taxpayers may be eligible for a refund related to business closure during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Additionally, as detailed further in the Personnel Reports, it is important to note that the District's number of teacher vacancies in the "Vacancy by School" report at the end of the 2019-2020 school year on June 12, 2020 was approximately 63 positions, meaning 99.3% of total teaching positions were filled. The "Position Summary" report is as of the end of the fiscal year, June 30, 2020, and reflects 342 teacher vacancies as a result of retirements and resignations after the end of the school year. The District's Talent Office has worked since the spring to hire new teachers for the 2020-21 school year. As of June 30th, the District was 99.8% staffed for teachers for the 2020-21 school year, with just 18 vacancies.

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<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Transfers from Reserves are not included in the total expenditures. FY20 transfers from reserves are an unfavorable net (\$13.3) million for trapped funds related to debt service; and a (\$25.0) million reserve for facilities. The net refunding impact of (\$1.9) million is also not included in total expenditures.

#### **Current Projection versus Amended Budget**

The Current FY20 year-end fund balance projection of \$178.5 million represents a \$19.5 million increase relative to the FY20 Amended Budget operating ending fund balance of \$159.0 million. The projected year-end fund balance represents 5.4% of operating expenditures and other uses, or less than three weeks of operating expense.

#### Revenues

As shown in the following table, the net change in operating revenues between the FY20 Amended Budget and the current year-end projection is a surplus of \$5.4 million:

The primary drivers of this projected \$5.4 million surplus include:

- A nearly \$31.0 million net increase in Local Tax Revenue, primarily made up a \$26.5 million increase in Business Use and Occupancy Tax, a net \$7.2 million increase in Real Estate Tax, a nearly \$2.2 million increase in School Income Tax, and a \$0.1 million increase in Ridesharing Revenue, offset by a (\$5.1) million reduction in Liquor Sales Tax.
- A \$1.1 million net increase in Local Non-Tax Revenue, primarily made up of increases in interest and investment earnings, and the Parking Authority contribution, partially offset by a reduction in Miscellaneous Non-Tax revenue.
- A (\$26.7) million net decrease in State Revenue, primarily due to a (\$22.2) million reduction in the Debt Service Subsidy related to State PlanCon<sup>3</sup> revenue, a (\$2.3) million reduction in Retirement reimbursement, a (\$1.8) million reduction in Social Security reimbursement, and a (\$1.2) million reduction in the Special Education Subsidy, partially offset by a net increase of \$0.7 million in all other State Revenue.

As noted above, the projected increase in Local Tax Revenue includes a \$26.5 million increase in Business Use and Occupancy Tax (U&O). However, this projection does not account for the risk of reduced future revenue associated with U&O credits that may be reflected in the upcoming months.

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<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> PlanCon is the Planning and Construction Workbook fund, which is administered by the state Department of Education and reimburses school districts for school construction projects.

#### **Expenditures**

The current year-end expenditure projection is (\$14.1) million lower than the FY20 Amended Budget:

The projected (\$14.1) million variance from the Amended Budget is primarily due to:

- A (\$5.4) million decrease in District Operated Schools, due primarily to savings of (\$5.7) million in capital programs related to timing of projects moving to FY21 and (\$2.8) million of savings for facilities and utilities, offset by a net all other increase of \$3.1 million primarily due to increased costs in elementary schools.
- A (\$3.9) million decrease in Charter School and Charter transportation expenditures.
- A (\$5.2) million decrease in Other Non-District Operated Schools, primarily due to an anticipated reduction in expense related to a change in accounting practice as the District transitioned to a new financial system in July 2020.
- A (\$1.2) million decrease in Administration due to reduced expenditures related to the COVID-19 closure.
- A \$1.6 million net increase in all other areas.

#### Issues and Risks

Since the school year and fiscal year are now over, the fourth quarter report reflects more updated and refined projections. However, the District has not completed its closing process so projections will continue to change until the closing process is complete and audited financial statements are prepared.

As noted above, the District's Business Use and Occupancy Tax projection is subject to significant risk given the unknowns related to potential U&O credits that may be taken in the coming months at a higher rate than in prior years due to COVID-19.

Additionally, some savings identified above related to capital projects are reflected as savings in FY20 due to the timing of project completion, but will result in increased expense in FY21 as projects are finalized.

Looking forward, economic uncertainty resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic will continue to threaten District revenue as the District experiences reduced tax revenues and the District's largest funders, the City of Philadelphia and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, manage their budgets through the economic crisis.

#### Conclusion

The current projections for FY20 reflect a narrow operating deficit of less than \$4.0 million (barely one-tenth of one percent of annual obligations) and marks the District's sixth consecutive year with a positive year end fund balance. The District has been able to achieve fiscal stability while investing in Philadelphia's students and schools at increasingly higher levels. Although the District's healthy fiscal outlook enabled it to weather the initial impacts of the pandemic, and prepare to begin FY21 without significant service cuts, the District is facing a formidable fiscal challenge going forward as a result of the pandemic and resulting economic recession.

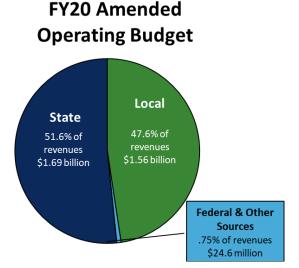
### **FY20 Amended Operating Budget Summary**

#### **FY20 Amended Projection**

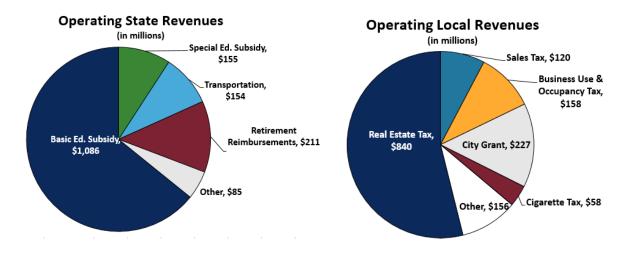
The District's budget consists of multiple funds: operating, categorical, capital, print, and food services. The amended projection, excluding refunding, for the operating budget includes a \$3.27 billion revenue budget and a \$3.30 billion expenditure budget.

#### Operating Revenues

District revenues are provided by the state, city, federal governments, and other sources.



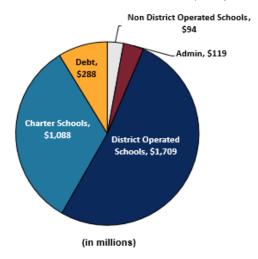
Approximately 53.9 percent of local revenues are generated from real estate tax. The remaining 46.1 percent of local revenues come from other taxes and fees and a City grant. Approximately 64.2 percent of state revenues are provided through the basic education subsidy. The remaining 35.8 percent of State revenues come from other subsidies and reimbursements.



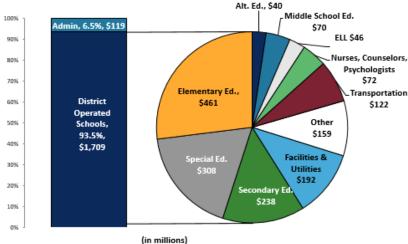

#### Operating Expenditures

The District's FY20 amended operating budget includes operating expenditures of \$3.30 billion. The District spends 87.7 percent of its operating budget directly on District, charter, and other non-District schools, with the remainder of the budget expended on debt service (8.7 percent) and District administration (3.6 percent).



Approximately 55.5 percent of the operating budget goes to District operated schools (including District administration). Of this amount, 93.5 percent goes to instruction, instructional support and other direct supports to schools. The remaining 6.5 percent is budgeted for District administration.



The remaining 44.5 percent is budgeted for charter schools (33.0 percent), other non-District operated schools (2.8 percent), and debt service (8.7 percent).

- Zero (0) requests for proposals were released in the month.
- Three (3) projects were newly assigned to begin design during the month.
- There are fifty three (53) projects assigned to a design professional.
- Zero (0) projects were publicly advertised for construction bids during the month.
- Zero (0) projects were submitted for action and approved by the Board of Education at the June 25, 2020, Public Action meeting.
- There are forty-eight (48) active construction projects, valued at \$137 million.
- JMT, program manager, has six (6) active construction projects, valued at \$179 million.
- Zero (0) construction projects reached substantial completion during the month.

As of June 30, 2020, the Office of Capital Programs had cash balances of \$507,170,811 across all bond funds of which 100% is committed for design and construction contracts, project contingencies, and staffing.

The Office of Capital Programs also had an outstanding expense credit of \$399,240; which was not included in the above cash balance.

As of June 30, 2020, the Office of Capital Programs had an adjusted available balance of \$507,570,051.

## QUARTERLY SCHOOL MANAGER REPORT SCHOOL BUDGET ALLOCATION METHODOLOGY

A school's budget consists of school-based allocations and centrally-allocated resources. The school-based allocations include both operating and grant resources. The operating resources are allocated for administration, teachers (enrollment driven + prep), school support positions, and discretionary funds. Grant resources are provided by Title I and Title II, SIG, and other grants. The centrally-allocated resources include positions such as special education, nurses, ESOL teachers, facilities, and security.

There is a proactive effort to assist schools in purchasing on an on-going basis. Further, as the year progresses, Finance staff identify those schools that are slow to spend their funds and contact them to identify roadblocks and assist in the spending process consistent with their Schoolwide Plan.
