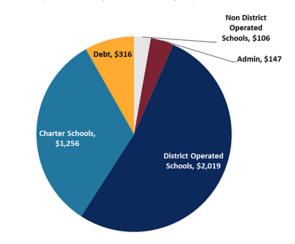

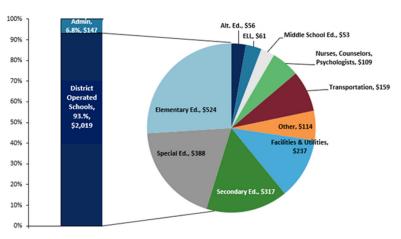

#### School Expenditures by Category (FY22 Projected



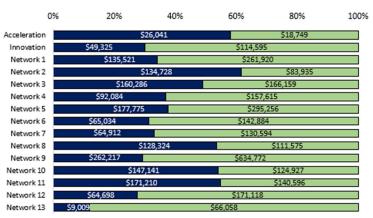

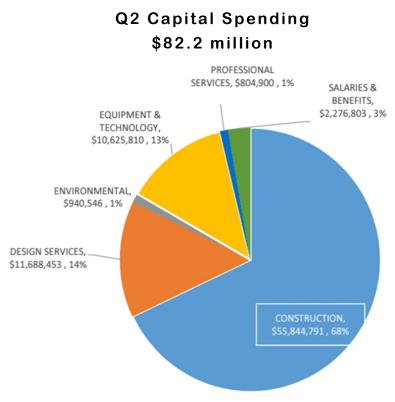
