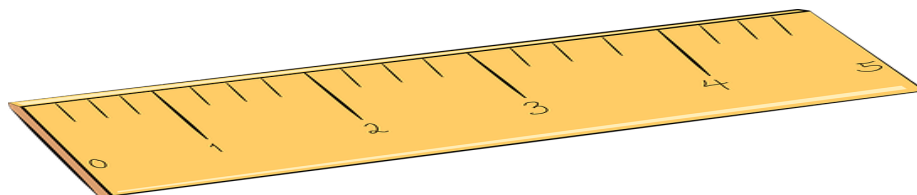


# IMMUNIZE!

**"In 2020, It's the Rule for Back to School."**



**PA Law mandates that every child K-12 be immunized on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of school.**

## Vaccination Requirements

Vaccines	Kindergarten & Grades 1-6	Grades 7-11	Grade 12
<b>Tetanus, diphtheria, and acellular pertussis</b> (Usually given as DTaP, DTP, DT, or Td) (1 dose on or after 4 <sup>th</sup> birthday)	<b>4 doses</b>	<b>4 doses</b>	<b>4 doses</b>

<b>Measles, Mumps, &amp; Rubella</b> (Usually given as MMR-1st dose must be on or after 1st birthday)	<b>2 doses</b>	<b>2 doses</b>	<b>2 doses</b>
<b>Hepatitis B</b>	<b>3 doses</b>	<b>3 doses</b>	<b>3 doses</b>
<b>Varicella (chickenpox)</b> (1st dose must be on or after 1st birthday)	<b>2 doses</b> or evidence of immunity	<b>2 doses</b> or evidence of immunity	<b>2 doses</b> or evidence of immunity
<b>Tetanus, diphtheria, acellular pertussis (Tdap)</b>	<b>Not applicable</b>	<b>1 dose</b>	<b>1 dose</b>
<b>Meningococcal Conjugate (MenACWY)</b>	<b>Not applicable</b>	<b>1 dose</b> (First dose is given at 11-15 years of age; a second dose is required at age 16 or entry into 12 <sup>th</sup> grade)	<b>1 or 2 doses</b> (If 1 <sup>st</sup> dose of MenACWY was given at 16 years of age or older, that shall count as the 12 <sup>th</sup> grade dose)
