

Get it wrong










Option 1: Meet in the Middle

Considerations

- Clear separation of circulation
- Can use collaboration areas on each floor as opportunity to crosscollaborate
- Sides align with entrance for each school

 Potential for more vertical circulation across all floors



Considerations

- Consolidates programs into two principle floors (less vertical travel)
- Creates "commons" on first floor for all students to share
- Potential to be more isolated and with less interaction
- Does not align with a particular entry



Considerations

- Clear separation of circulation
- Collaboration on each floor as an opportunity for cross-pollination
- Sides align with entrance for each school
- Creates individual "living rooms" for each school

 Potential for more vertical circulation over several floors
