#### **B. Bidder Questions and Answers**

#### 1. Question:

Please advise if any addenda have been issued for this project?

Answer: This is the first addendum issued.

#### 2. Question:

Please advise if the bid date remains 9/11/18?

Answer: Bids are due on Tuesday, September 18, 2018. Refer to Invitation to Bid in Contract Documents.

#### 3. Question:

When is the anticipated NTP?

Answer: Notice to Proceed is anticipated to be issued on or about December 1, 2018, but that is not guaranteed. The Contractor will have whatever number of days are available between the Notice to Proceed and the fixed completion dates to do the work.

#### 4. Question:

Can the existing onsite material be managed as Clean Fill in accordance with the PADEP Clean Fill Standards?

The Environmental Coordination Specification Section 01 1100 within the bid documents outlines a soil management plan for the project that the Contractor must adhere to.

#### 5. Question:

Can the existing material be used for backfill?

The Environmental Coordination Specification Section 01 1100 within the bid documents outlines a soil management plan for the project that the Contractor must adhere to.

#### 6. Question:

Is there a geotechnical report for this project? If yes, can we have a copy of it?

Answer: There is not a geotechnical report for this project. However, an Infiltration Testing Report with geotechnical laboratory soil testing results was provided in the Bid Documents for informational purposes only.

#### 7. Question:

Were there borings done below the asphalt and concrete for this project?

Answer: Asphalt pavement coring results were provided in the Bid Documents as an attachment to the specifications for informational purposes only.

#### 8. Question:

Are there any work hour restrictions on this project?

Answer: Refer to Section 01 1300 TIME OF COMPLETION, etc. for phasing and sequencing requirements and other work restrictions.

#### 9. Question:

Who is responsible for testing and inspection work?

Answer: The Contractor is responsible for all testing and inspection with the exception of soil testing as outlined within the Environmental Coordination Specification 01 1100.

#### 10. Question:

Will our workers be able to parking on site?

**Answer: NO** 

#### 11. Question:

What permits will the contractor be responsible for?

Answer: The contractor is responsible for obtaining all required permits, including but not limited to: (1) Picking up the approved Building Permit at L&I; (2) Picking up the approved plans and obtaining a Plumbing Permit and New Connection Permit from PWD's

Water Transport Records Department for the new storm pipe connection; (3) a Curb & Footway Permit; (4) Street Closure Permit; and (5) a Street Opening Permit.

#### 12. Question:

Will there be any consideration given for the high percentages of M&WBE Subcontractor goals and DBE supplier goals? We feel that it will be difficult for this type of project to possibly meet all 3 goals.

Answer: No. Goals remain the same.

#### 13. Question:

Can recycled crushed concrete be used in lieu of 2A stone provided it meets the gradation requirements?

Answer: Yes. Per paragraph 2.1F of the Earthwork specification 312000, recycled crushed concrete may be used as an asphalt base course as long as it meets the requirements of 2A coarse aggregate specified in PENNDOT 408. Testing results will need to be submitted and approved by Engineer of Record.

#### 14. Question:

Will there be a need for an owner's trailer or any temporary utilities for this project? **Answer: No.** 

#### 15. Question:

Can sand bags be used on temporary fencing?

Answer: Anchoring of the temporary fencing is at the discretion of the Contractor, but the site must be secure from the public and safe at all times. The temporary barriers shown in the Sidewalk Closure Plan (C-309) must comply with the details shown on the Sidewalk Closure Plan and Streets Department standards, therefore sandbags are not permissible here.

#### 16. Question:

Please confirm there is no electrical transformer work in this project. On the demolition plan the hatching for removing full depth asphalt was overlayed on top of the existing concrete transformer pad. Please advise.

Answer: This project does not include any electrical transformer work. Existing concrete at transformer pad to remain.

#### 17. Question:

What are the minimum mowing and watering requirements for the Turfs & Grasses Specification? Since we do not employ Lawn Care maintenance crews can the engineer or owner please provide how many visits will be required? We will need to let the company we higher know if this will need to be a weekly or possibly a biweekly event. And during what months will these activities be required?

Answer: The number or frequency of visits cannot be pre-determined by the Engineer or Owner. The lawn care professional should determine the approximate number of visits that would be required over the one year maintenance period to achieve the maintenance requirements of the Turf and Grasses Specification 329200. Per 329200, the maintenance

period for turf and meadow grasses is one year from the project's date of Substantial Completion.

#### 18. Question:

Besides the (1) 24" Stop Bar at the driveway entrance on Clearfield Street, is there any other pavement markings required for this project?

Answer: The stop bar is the only pavement marking required for this project.

#### 19. Question:

Will a Police officer be required for set-up and take-down of temporary barriers?

Answer: Contractor shall confirm with the City of Philadelphia. Requirements are based on traffic concerns.

#### 20. Question:

The bid form and OEO participation form reference an electrical project. Can this be corrected and the OEO goals confirmed to be for this project?

Answer: Corrected Bid Proposal Form is attached. MBE/WBE Goals stated on the Notice to Bidders are confirmed to be for this project

#### 21. Question:

Are there any proposed pavement markings on the new parking lots?

Answer: The stop bar is the only pavement marking required for this project.

#### 22. Question:

On the Landscape drawing there are call outs for Turf Grass. Is this meant to be sod? Please advise.

Answer: No sod is specified for this project. The turf grass mixes specified for this project shall be one of the three mixes listed in Section 2.1 of the Turf and Grasses Specification.

#### 23. Question:

Can the existing asphalt in the northern lot of Phase 1 be milled in place and compacted? Answer: Milling is not acceptable in northern lot of Phase 1. A full-depth asphalt section with binder course and wearing course is required on a rubbelized asphalt and existing stone base (per detail) or on a 100% stone base at the Contractor's discretion.

#### 24. Question:

Please provide approximate tie-in elevation for the proposed 24" RCP in W. Clearfield Street. **Answer:** The tie-in elevation at the brick storm sewer must be verified in field by the Contractor. Contractor must consult with City plans for the approximate depth of the existing pipe invert below the street surface.

#### 25. Question:

Please provide starting dates for the ending dated in the specifications. These will be necessary with the inclusion of liquidated damages.

Answer: Completion dates are fixed to specific dates. Contractor will have whatever number of days are available from the Notice to Proceed to the fixed completion dates

#### 26. Question:

In lieu of pulverizing the existing asphalt & stone in phase 1 is removal & replacement acceptable? Answer: Yes. The Contractor can chose an aggregate base made up of rubblelized asphalt and existing stone or remove all asphalt and use a 100% stone base.

#### 27. Question:

Are any of the pavement areas to be used for parking? If so, will you please provide a drawing with pavement markings?

Answer: Pavement markings for parking spaces are not required for this project. Only the stop bar is required at the lot's driveway onto Clearfield St.

#### 28. Question:

Can all excess material in phase 1 be used as fill or is the intent to export this material and import clean fill?

The Environmental Coordination Specification Section 01 1100 within the bid documents outlines a soil management plan for the project that the Contractor must adhere to.

#### 29. Question:

When does the district expect to issue the addendum and is there going to be a bid extension? **Answer: This is the addendum and no bid extension is being considered.** 

#### 30. Question:

Reference to the Bid Form on page 2, the heading for the Unit Prices section says (Included in the Lump Sum Price Above). Please clarify why this would need to be included in the Base Bid if we are supplying a unit price and a total for the Offsite Disposal of excess regulated fill based on 873 CY?

Answer: The Base Bid, <u>including</u> the <u>estimated</u> quantities for Unit Price Work, is used to determine the lowest bidder for award; however, the contractor will be paid for the <u>actual</u> quantities of unit price work, whether more or less than the estimated quantities.

#### CONSTRUCTION CERTIFICATION PACKAGE

#### **Purpose:**

The intent of this Construction Certification Package is to ensure that acceptable documentation is maintained during the construction of stormwater management practices (SMPs). For general information and design requirements for different types of SMPs, please refer to Chapter 4 of the PWD Stormwater Management Guidance Manual.

#### **General Construction Requirements:**

During construction, the contractor must ensure that a copy of the Approved Post-Construction Stormwater Management Plan (PCSMP) and Erosion and Sediment Control (E&S) Plan are available on-site at all times.

Prior to any earth disturbance activities, a preconstruction meeting must be held. All parties including, but not limited to, the property owner's representative, the design professional, the contractor, the PWD Inspector, and state and municipal authorities are required to attend. As part of the preconstruction meeting, a time table for the project's construction sequence stages must be provided. The PWD Inspector must be contacted at least seven (7) days prior to the date of the preconstruction meeting to ensure that appropriate staff can be present. If at least seven (7) days' notice is not provided, PWD cannot guarantee that the preconstruction meeting will be held on the requested date. Further, earth disturbance activities should not commence until the preconstruction meeting is held.

The PWD Inspector must be notified at least three (3) days prior to the start of construction of any SMP elements. If the required notice is not provided, the project site may be subject to the enforcement actions outlined in the Stormwater Regulations. Any SMP, or portion of a SMP, that is constructed without prior notice to PWD or without the PWD Inspector present on-site may be required to be removed and reconstructed.

#### **SMP Construction Certification Forms:**

The Construction Certification Package contains a separate SMP Construction Certification Form for each SMP. Please note that the items identified within these forms represent the minimum documentation required. Additional documentation may be deemed necessary by PWD staff on a project-specific basis.

SMP Construction Certification Forms must be prepared by the project's design professional, reviewed by PWD during the PCSMP Review Phase, and completed by one of the following registered professionals during construction: Professional Engineer, Registered Architect, Landscape Architect, Professional Land Surveyor, Professional Geologist, or Licensed Contractor. The registered professional who completes each SMP Construction Certification Form must complete the "Registered Professional" section of that form. These registered professionals may also prepare and submit Record Drawings to PWD. Please note that PA DEP may have different requirements regarding the types of professionals who may prepare Record Drawings. For projects that require a NPDES Permit, the applicant is strongly encouraged to refer to PA DEP's



requirements for Record Drawings before selecting a professional to prepare Record Drawing(s) for PWD.

Each SMP Construction Certification Form must indicate the measurements that are most critical to the listed SMP's ability to perform its designed function (e.g., elevations, outlet control sizes, surface areas, layer depths, etc.). It is recommended that the SMP Construction Certification Form(s) be included in the construction bid documents for the project to ensure that the selected contractor is aware of the requirement that the Forms be completed during construction. The project's sequence of construction will identify all stages of SMP construction for which a registered professional must document the specific elevations and measurements found on the SMP Construction Certification Forms.

Each measurement documented on the Forms must be dated and initialed by the registered professional who took, or whose designee took, the measurement. Once all of the required measurements have been appropriately documented, the registered professional must execute and date the Form. The contractor should not cover, backfill, or seal any SMP until the information required for the Record Drawing(s) and the Construction Certification Package has been acquired.

#### **Supplementary Documentation:**

Electronic copies of all photos, material receipts, reports, and certifications required within the SMP Construction Certification Forms (at minimum) must be provided to PWD. Material receipts must clearly specify the types, qualities, and quantities of the materials purchased.

#### **Construction Certification Package Submission:**

The Construction Certification Package must include electronic copies of all completed SMP Construction Certification Forms and all supplementary documentation required by the Forms. The Construction Certification Package must be submitted to PWD along with the project's Record Drawing(s) once construction is completed, all of which will be reviewed as part of the project's Record Drawing Review Phase. Please refer to Section 2.3.1 of the PWD Stormwater Management Guidance Manual for more information regarding the Record Drawing Review Phase. The measurements/specifications required to be documented on the SMP Construction Certification Forms must be reflected on the project's Record Drawing(s). Refer to the Record Drawing Requirements document, provided by PWD at the project preconstruction meeting, for a summary of what information must be reflected on the Record Drawing(s) and how this information must be documented. More detailed information on Record Drawings can be found in Section 5.3.2 of the PWD Stormwater Management Guidance Manual.
