

Lewis C. Cassidy Academics Plus School's Parent and Family Engagement Policy

In support of strengthening student academic achievement, <u>Lewis C. Section A: JOINTLY DEVELOPED

<u>Lewis C. Cassidy Academics Plus School</u> will take the following actions to involve parents in an organized, ongoing, and timely manner in the planning, review, and improvement of Title I programs, including opportunities for regular meetings, if requested by parents, to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their child and respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible.

All of these partners work with us to host several annual events to support families, such as Literacy Alive where we share information on reading, host fun events for students and provide information on reading strategies for families. Additionally, Experience Corp hosts several literacy events throughout the year in which they bring in local authors and other conduct literacy based activities.

Section G: BUILDING CAPACITY OF PARENTS

<u>Lewis C. Cassidy Academics Plus School</u> will build the parents' capacity for strong parent and family engagement to ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership among the school and the community to improve student academic achievement through the following:

- Cassidy supports parents by providing literate on student reading levels, we also send
 home interim reports at the midpoint of each quarter. Additionally, we hold report
 card conferences. Lastly, we hold at least 2 academic parent meetings in which parents
 can learn about PA Common Core Math and ELA standards and how they can help;
 their students excel on the PSSA.

Section H: BUILDING CAPACITY OF SCHOOL STAFF

<u>Lewis C. Cassidy Academics Plus School</u> will provide training to educate teachers, specialized instructional support personnel, principals, and other school leaders, and other staff, with the assistance of parents, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, implement and coordinate parent programs, and build ties between parents and the school by:

- Cassidy will host at least 2 Parent meetings on Common Core ELA standards in order to provide necessary literacy training for parents from Title I, Part A funds if the school has exhausted all other reasonably available sources of funding for that training.
- Cassidy will utilize Title 1 Parental involvement funds in order to pay reasonable and necessary expenses associated with local parent and family engagement activities, including transportation and child care costs, to enable parents to participate in school-related meetings and training sessions.
- Cassidy will utilize the FACE office to train and engage parents on the School Advisory Council to recruit other parents in order to train parents to enhance the engagement of other parents.
