Support Your Child's Regular Attendance in School. Students who attend school consistently are more likely to read on grade level and graduate on time.

- Sign Up For Parent Portal and Check Your Account Often.
 Parent Portal is the best way to monitor your child's progress, grades, attendance and more.

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Attend Report Card Conferences.

Take advantage of conferences and other opportunities to engage with your child's teachers and have deeper conversations about your child's progress. To find upcoming conference dates, visit philasd.org/calendar.

Explore Academic and Enrichment Opportunities.

The District offers a variety of opportunities through schools or through the central office. Talk with your child about opportunities to enhance their learning and find activities aligned to their areas of interest and need, including: tutoring options, credit recovery programs, extra-curricular programs, summer programs, and other resources. Remember to consider resources and opportunities for English Language Learners and students with Individualized Education Plans.
