

All students in the School District of Philadelphia are required to wear uniforms.

Our uniforms consist of navy blue bottoms (shorts, skorts, skirts, pants or jumpers) and blue or white polo shirts or button down shirts for students in grades K-5; Hunter green polo shirts and khaki bottoms (shorts, skorts, skirts, pants or jumpers) for students in grades 6-8.

No hoodies are to be worn in the building at any time. Pullover sweatshirts can be worn in the winter months. Uniforms are expected to be worn on class trips. The only exception is during 8<sup>th</sup> grade closing activities.

No open toed shoes, or large earrings are to be worn in school. Students who come to school with these items will be asked to remove them and they will be confiscated.

Consequences for not wearing a uniform to school include, but are not limited to, conferences, detentions and exclusion from privileges. Children may be asked to call home so that a uniform can be brought to school for them, or students will be asked to change into a uniform we keep at school.

On occasion we will announce dress down days when children may pay a small fee so they can dress out of uniform. Sometimes these might be around a theme. Money collected for dress down days will go into our Student Activities Fund to benefit special programs and/or incentives for all students.
