

Career and Technical Education (CTE) Options

- <u>Logistics, Materials and Supply Chain Management</u>. An instructional program that prepares individuals in the fields of sales, distribution, and marketing operations, and focuses on the process and techniques of direct wholesale and retail buying and selling operations.
- <u>Plumbing Technology</u>. An instructional program that prepares students to apply technical knowledge and skills in layout, assembly, installation and repair of pipes, fitting and fixtures for steam, hot water, heating, cooling, drainage, lubricating, sprinkling and industrial processing systems to specifications and plumbing codes
- <u>Welding Technology</u>. An instructional program that prepares individuals to apply technical knowledge and skills in gas, arc, shielded and non-shielded metal arc, brazing, flame cutting and plastic welding.

- <u>Automotive Mechanics Technology</u>. An instructional program that prepares individuals to apply technical knowledge and skills to engage in the servicing and maintenance of all types of automobiles.
- <u>Auto Collision & Repair Technology</u>. A specialized instructional program that provides learning experiences concerned with all phases of the repair of damaged vehicle bodies and frames.
- <u>Cinematography and Film/Video Production</u>. An instructional program that prepares individuals to communicate dramatic information, ideas, moods and feelings through the making and producing of films and videos.
- *Graphic Design*. An instructional program in the applied visual arts that prepares individuals to use artistic techniques to effectively communicate ideas and information to business and consumer audiences via illustrations and other forms of printed media.
- <u>Cosmetology</u>. An instructional program that prepares individuals to care for and beautify hair, skin, and nails.
- <u>Culinary Arts</u>. An instructional program that prepares students for employment related to institutional, commercial or self-owned food establishments or other food industry occupations.
- <u>Electrical and Power Transmission</u>. An instructional program that prepares individuals to apply technical knowledge and skills necessary to install, operate, maintain and repair electrically energized residential, commercial and industrial systems, and DC and AC motors, controls and electrical distribution panels.
- <u>Health Related Technologies</u>. An instructional program designed for individuals whose career objective is one within the technical allied health field.
