Philly Fundamentals

The Office of Grant Development encourages all principals and their designees to update their Philly FUNDamentals accounts. This platform, managed by The Fund for the School District of Philadelphia, allows any donor to find a school and directly give that school's needs identified by the principal. Once a Philly FUNDamentals account is created, the schools are plotted on a map, and donors can search the site to find a profile of each school. School profiles include a message from the principal, a description of the need, school performance and demographic information, and a link to the school's website. After learning more about the school, donors give directly toward the cost of the project with the simple click of a button.


Literacy Grant Teaser

Due Date: September 1 - October 15, 2021

Eligible Applicants: K-12 Schools or Non-Profit Organizations that serve any grades K-12 in the U.S.

Purpose: The Bee Grant Program seeks to stimulate in young people a curiosity about the importance of bees in our lives and food system, the need to understand and embrace them, and the value of caring about their well-being.

Estimated Range of Awards: All Bee Grant options are valued at \$2,000 per grant

Due Date: June 16 - October 15, 2021

Eligible Applicants: We invite applications from educators, specialized instructional support personnel, and education support professional who are members of the NEA.

Purpose: The NEA Foundation wants to support educators engaging students in project-based and deeper learning to support the development of skills and dispositions contributing to success and fulfillment in a changing world.

Estimated Range of Awards: \$2,000 - \$5,000

Opportunity: The NEA Foundation Envision Equity Grants

Due Date: June 16 - October 15, 2021

Eligible Applicants: We invite applications from educators, specialized instructional support personnel, and education support professional who are members of the NEA.

Purpose: In particular, the NEA Foundation wants to ensure that educators have opportunities to lead in an equity-focused reimagining of public education, encouraging students' love of learning, and the best possible educational experience for every child.

Estimated Range of Awards: \$1,500 - \$5,000

Opportunity: NCTM Equity in Mathematics Grant grades 6-12

Due Date: November 1

Eligible Applicants: The applicant must be a current Essential or Premium member of NCTM or teach at a school with a current membership.

Purpose: The purpose of this grant is to incorporate classroom materials or lessons that will improve the achievement of student groups that have previous records of underachievement, sometimes identified by race, gender, region, or culture.

Estimated Range of Awards: Maximum of \$8,000

Opportunity: The Peter R. Marsh Foundation, Middle School Music Grant.

Due Date: September 1 - January 31st , 2021

Eligible Applicants: All public Middle Schools in the United States, which have a music curriculum, are eligible to apply for the Peter R. Marsh Foundation's Music Grant.

Purpose: The primary purpose of the Music Grant Program is to support schools in their prioritized efforts to embed social and emotional intelligence in students. Student participation in public service activities is widely recognized as an effective way to accomplish this objective. The Music Grant Program endows student public service.

Opportunity: Klorane Botanical Foundation, Budding Botanist Grant


Due Date: Friday, October 29th, 2021

Eligible Applicants: Any public school, charter school, or private school serving students in grades K to 12 in the United States. Applicants must be planning a new or expanding an existing school garden program designed to teach students about environmental sustainability and the importance of biodiversity. Previous Budding Botanist winners are not eligible.

Purpose: The Budding Botanist Grant will help our youngest citizens learn about plants, explore their world and inspire them to take care of the life they discover in their local ecosystems.

Opportunity: American Battlefield Trust Civil War Traveling Trunk

Due Date: The application window opens August 1

Eligible Applicants: All Teachers

Purpose: The Civil War Traveling Trunk program provides reproduction Civil War artifacts, books, music, and other various materials for teachers to utilize during their Civil War-era instruction. The trunk fosters greater interest in the American Civil War and battlefield preservation by allowing students to have a hands-on experience.

Estimated Range of Awards: The Civil War Traveling Trunk is FREE for teachers!

Opportunity: SnapDragon Book Foundation

Due Date: November 2021-February, 2022

Eligible Applicants: Any school library that serves disadvantaged youth may apply.

Purpose: The Snapdragon Book Foundation was started in December, 2008 to provide funds to improve school libraries for disadvantaged children. Grants will be awarded to public, private, and experimental schools.

Estimated Range of Awards: Grants typically range from \$2,500 to \$10,000.

Due Date: The 1st of every month

Eligible Applicants: Community-based mentoring, tutoring, and family literacy programs

Purpose: TFBP provides new books to children in need addressing one of the most important factors affecting literacy – access to books. TFBP supplies books to schools, after-school programs and other organizations that already have the tools to teach and use the books for lessons, and then the books go home with the kids so they can share the joy of reading with their family and friends. All books distributed by First Book are brand new and are provided at no cost to the child.
