School Resource Academy Rubric

School Resource Academy offers 10 schools the opportunity to cultivate fund development skills (i.e grant writing, healthy fundraising, pitch development, social media, crowdfunding etc.) and create/strengthen their networks of wealth to support school priorities. This is an intensive, hands-on pilot project developed for schools that have strong leadership teams and supportive school communities.

School Leadership will be asked to:

- Meet with the Office of Grant Development to determine school priorities and strategies -Identify a school team with (2) school based staff and (2) parents/community members.

School teams will be asked to:

-Attend a minimum of twice monthly workshops where they will be compensated -Participate in fund development activities that will raise up to \$10,000 per school

School and School teams will:

- Increase Fund-development skill-sets
- Establish and strengthen networks of wealth within school communities
- Apply for a grant
- Complete a fundraiser
- Present a pitch to local Philadelphians interested in your school success
- Be empowered and prepared to create sustained fund development practices

School Resource Academy Selection Criteria

1. Principal Tenure

- Priority is for selected schools to have Principals with 3+ years of tenure at their current school.
- 2. Development Experience/Network of Support
 - Priority is for selected schools to have minimal experience or ongoing support with few fund development efforts

3. School Team Readiness

- Priority is for selected schools to have identified a potential school team with the capacity and interest for fund development activities to support School Resource Academy.
- 4. Clear School Fundraising Priorities
 - Priority is for selected schools to have clear articulated fundraising priorities or a desire to create fundraising priorities, as stated by the principal, related to Goals and Guardrails

5. Potential Program Impact

• Priority is for selected schools who can identify the importance of the project and the potential sustainable impact for their classrooms and school.
