
# **Grant Opportunity Newsletter**

#### Office of Grant Development PD Offerings

For SY 22/23 The Office of Grant Development will be offering our PD: Fundraising for Public Schools: Intro to DonorsChoose. <u>Anyone who spends 75 percent or more of their time in student-facing activities may request this PD on School-Directed PD days.</u>

<u>DonorsChoose</u> is the ONLY teacher crowdfunding platform that is approved by the SDP's Board of Education.

Since 2007, over 5,000 SDP teachers have brought in nearly \$13.7 million in resources to their classrooms and schools with DonorsChoose. In this session, OGD staff review SDP policies on fundraising, and best practices for using DonorsChoose. Our staff is often joined by a teacher who is experienced in using DonorsChoose, who share their first-person experiences. **Opportunity:** Whole Kids Foundation Bee Grant

Due Date: October 15th, 2022

Eligible Applicants: K-12 Schools or Non-Profit Organizations that

serve any grades K-12 in the U.S./Canada

Purpose: The Bee Grant Program seeks to stimulate in young people a curiosity about the importance of bees in our lives and food system, the need to understand and embrace them, and the value of caring about their well-being.

**Opportunity:** Kids Gardening Budding Botanist Grant

Due Date: October 14th, 2022

Eligible Applicants: Any nonprofit organization, public or private school, or youth program in the United States or US Territories planning a new garden program or expanding an established one that serves at least 15 youth between the ages of 3 and 18 is eligible to apply.

Purpose: Designed to further the mission of the Klorane Botanical Foundation, the Budding Botanist grant will help our youngest students learn about plants, explore their world, and inspire them to take care of the life they discover in their local ecosystems. In 2023, twenty schools across the country will be awarded \$1000 each in grant funding

**Opportunity:** Kids Gardening Youth Garden Grant

Due Date: October 17th - December 2, 2022

**Eligible Applicants:** Any nonprofit organization, public or private school, or youth program in the United States or US Territories planning a new garden program or expanding an established one that serves at least 15 youth between the ages of 3 and 18 is eligible to apply.

Purpose: Since 1982, the Youth Garden Grant has supported school and youth educational garden projects that enhance the quality of life for students and their communities. In 2023, fifty programs will receive award packages consisting of a cash prize and a variety of gardening tools and supplies.

Estimated Range of Awards: Award Packages valued at \$1,050

**Opportunity:** Kids Gardening GroMoreGood Grant

Due Date: January 3rd - February 10th, 2023

Eligible Applicants: Any nonprofit organization, public or private school, or youth program in the United States or US Territories planning a new garden program or expanding an established one that serves at least 15 youth between the ages of 3 and 18 is eligible to apply.

Purpose: The GroMoreGood Grassroots Grant, brought to you by The Scotts Miracle-Gro Foundation and KidsGardening, is designed to bring the life-enhancing benefits of gardens to communities across the United States. 165 programs will be awarded in 2023.

**Opportunity:** Wild Ones Seeds for Education Grants

Due Date: July 15th – November 15th, 2022.

Eligible Applicants: School, nature centers or youth groups

Purpose: For more than 20 years, this Wild Ones donor-funded program has provided small grants ranging from \$100 to \$500 for naturally landscaped projects throughout the United States. These funds are designated for native plants and seeds for outdoor learning areas that engage children, preschool to high school. Youth participate directly in the planning, planting, and care of the native plant gardens.

Estimated Range of Awards: \$100 to \$500

**Opportunity:** American Heart Association Teaching Gardens Network

Due Date: October 28th, 2022

Eligible Applicants: School garden start-ups or existing gardens are eligible.

Purpose: The American Heart Association is seeking schools and educational facilities that are working to connect children to the garden, supporting health, nutrition, and environmental stewardship. Through this grant program, we hope to build strong communities who commit to growing healthy kids. Program elements include building, growing and maintaining a garden, providing a hands-on learning experience, and teaching students about healthy eating and gardening via an interactive cross-curricular, standards-based gardening and nutrition education curriculum.

**Eligible Applicants:** Schools serving grades 6 through 8 that have not previously received funding. For sports starting in March, April, or May, applications must be submitted before the 15th of February. For sports starting in August, September, or October, applications must be submitted before the 15th of May. For sports starting in November, December, January, or February, applications must be submitted before the 15th of October.

Purpose: The Justin J. Watt Foundation offers support to middle schools that do not have sufficient funding for after-school and athletic programs. The foundation offers Equipment Grants for after-school programs, such as athletic teams for grade 6 through 8. Examples of eligible items include uniforms with school name or numbers; safety equipment, such as helmets, pads, or mats; balls, bats, or nets; and storage equipment.

Opportunity: Team First Book Philadelphia

Due Date: The 1st of every month

Eligible Applicants: Community-based mentoring, tutoring, and family literacy programs

Purpose: TFBP provides new books to children in need addressing one of the most important factors affecting literacy – access to books. TFBP supplies books to schools, after-school programs and other organizations that already have the tools to teach and use the books for lessons, and then the books go home with the kids so they can share the joy of reading with their family and friends. All books distributed by First Book are brand new and are provided at no cost to the child.

Opportunity: American Battlefield Trust

**Due Date: N/A** 

Eligible Applicants: You must be an active and full-time K-12 educator or administrator to apply to the Field Trip Fund. All applicants will be notified within two weeks of their application status.

Purpose: The American Battlefield Field Trip Fund is designed to help offset the cost of K-12 field trips to sites related to the Revolutionary War, War or 1812, and the American Civil War. Approved applicants can receive up to \$1,500 in funding for their field trip. Funds can be applied to transportation to and from the site(s), guide fees, and admissions to the historic sites. We do not provide funding for first-class accommodations, souvenirs, or overnight stays/accommodations. (Please visit our Field Trip Fund page for more information.)




