# Office of Grant Development PD Offerings

For SY 22/23 The Office of Grant Development will be offering our PD: Fundraising for Public Schools: Intro to DonorsChoose. <u>Anyone who</u> <u>spends 75 percent or more of their time in student-facing activities</u> may request this PD on School-Directed PD days.

<u>DonorsChoose</u> is the ONLY teacher crowdfunding platform that is approved by the SDP's Board of Education.

Since 2007, over 5,000 SDP teachers have brought in nearly \$13.7 million in resources to their classrooms and schools with DonorsChoose. In this session, OGD staff review SDP policies on fundraising, and best practices for using DonorsChoose. Our staff is often joined by a teacher who is experienced in using DonorsChoose, who share their first-person experiences. **Opportunity:** The McCarthey Dressman Education Foundation

Due Date: April 15th, 2023

Eligible Applicants: K-12 Educators

**Purpose:** The Foundation provides both academic enrichment grants and teacher development grants. The Foundation sponsors proposals that enhance student learning and educational quality, paying particular attention to those that best serve the at-risk and under-funded, including: Curriculum that excites and challenges; inquiry projects that promote reflection and growth; and after-school programs that enrich and inspire. **Eligible Applicants:** Be a charter or public school including tribally controlled and Bureau of Indian Education schools, non-profit private school, a non-profit organization or tribal entity that serves children in the K-12 age range, or a government entity. Must engage at least 10 children on a regular basis and growing edible plants in your garden

**Purpose:** At Whole Kids Foundation, we know that the more kids know and feel connected to their food, the more curious they become about how things grow or taste, and the more willing they are to try new foods. This is why we believe in edible garden learning spaces!

Due Date: Ongoing

Eligible Applicants: 501c3s

**Purpose:** To inspire and enable high-poverty youth to participate in sports.

Estimated Range of Awards: Up to \$25,000

**Opportunity:** Justin J. Watts Foundation

Due Date: Ongoing

**Eligible Applicants:** Schools serving grades 6 through 8 that have not previously received funding. For sports starting in March, April, or May, applications must be submitted before the 15th of February. For sports starting in August, September, or October, applications must be submitted before the 15th of May. For sports starting in November, December, January, or February, applications must be submitted before the 15th of October.

**Purpose:** The Justin J. Watt Foundation offers support to middle schools that do not have sufficient funding for after-school and athletic programs. The foundation offers Equipment Grants for after-school programs, such as athletic teams for grade 6 through 8. Examples of eligible items include uniforms with school name or numbers; safety equipment, such as helmets, pads, or mats; balls, bats, or nets; and storage equipment.

Eligible Applicants: Community-based mentoring, tutoring, and family literacy programs

**Purpose:** TFBP provides new books to children in need addressing one of the most important factors affecting literacy – access to books. TFBP supplies books to schools, after-school programs and other organizations that already have the tools to teach and use the books for lessons, and then the books go home with the kids so they can share the joy of reading with their family and friends. All books distributed by First Book are brand new and are provided at no cost to the child.

**Opportunity:** American Battlefield Trust

Due Date: N/A

**Eligible Applicants:** You must be an active and full-time K-12 educator or administrator to apply to the Field Trip Fund. All applicants will be notified within two weeks of their application status.

**Purpose:** The American Battlefield Field Trip Fund is designed to help offset the cost of K-12 field trips to sites related to the Revolutionary War, War or 1812, and the American Civil War. Approved applicants can receive up to \$1,500 in funding for their field trip. Funds can be applied to transportation to and from the site(s), guide fees, and admissions to the historic sites. We do not provide funding for first-class accommodations, souvenirs, or overnight stays/accommodations. (Please visit our Field Trip Fund page for more information.)
