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Grant Opportunities

The OGD has reviewed all of the opportunities to ensure that all are still accepting applications as of October 1st and are appropriate for our audience, however, it is possible that changes were made after our review. Please be sure to carefully review the funder's policies and practices before beginning any application and reach out to OGD with any changes you find.

Upcoming Deadlines

Opportunity: Whole Kids Foundation Traditional Bee Grant

Due Date: Part 1 due October 15; Part 2 due October 31

Eligible Applicants: K-12 schools or nonprofit organizations that serve any grades K-12 who have not received a Traditional Bee Grant

Purpose: The Traditional Bee Grant provides a choice of either a monetary award or equipment intended to support schools in bringing live bees to their campus or grow their already existing educational hive program.

NOTE: Bees are not included with any grant option. A knowledgeable beekeeper or appropriate bee educator must commit to help support and maintain the beehive as the "Bee Mentor".

Estimated Range of Awards: Choice of either a monetary grant of \$1500 or indoor observation hive

Grant Opportunities

Opportunity: Lorrie Otto Seeds for Education Program

Due Date: November 15, 2023

Eligible Applicants: Schools, nature centers or youth groups

Purpose: The funds are designated for acquiring native plants and seeds for outdoor learning areas that engage children, preschool to high school. Youth participate directly in the planning, planting and caring for native plant gardens.

Estimated Range of Awards: \$100-\$500

Opportunity: Environmental Education Mini Grants

Due Date: November 15, 2023

Eligible Applicants: Schools and Home and School Associations with Principal Approval

Purpose: The PA Department of Environmental Protection is offering schools mini grants of up to \$5,000 to fund innovative environmental education projects. The goal of environmental education is an environmentally literate citizenry, prepared to make informed decisions and take positive actions to help ensure the state's natural resources are available for the use and enjoyment of future generations. Priority is given to environmental education projects that engage people living, working and/or attending school within Environmental Justice areas in topics related to Climate Change and/or Water.

Eligible costs include travel, resources such as educational materials, supplies, and equipment/technology, and staffing if they do not exceed 50% of grant funds. *Involvement of partners is highly encouraged.*

Matching Grant: Yes - *A match of any amount is required (20% is encouraged). It can be cash and/or in-kind.*

Estimated Range of Awards: \$5,000

Grant Opportunities

Opportunity: Justin J. Watts Foundation

Due Date: Spring Sports (Mar, Apr, May) - Apply through February 15, 2024

Eligible Applicants: Schools serving grades 6-8 ***that have not previously received funding.***

Purpose: The Justin J. Watt Foundation offers support to middle schools that do not have sufficient funding for after-school and athletic programs. The foundation offers Equipment Grants for after-school programs, such as athletic teams for grade 6 through 8. Examples of eligible items include uniforms with school name or numbers; safety equipment, such as helmets, pads, or mats; balls, bats, or nets; and reasonable storage equipment.

Estimated Range of Awards: Awards Vary

Opportunity: B'nai B'rith Educators Unit 5290

Due Date: December 1, 2023

Eligible Applicants: Teachers of all grade levels

Purpose: B'nai B'rith Educators Unit, Charter No. 5290 is funding grants in support of the instructional program at schools. The purpose is to provide students with opportunities and/or materials not available within the confines of school budgets. This can include, but is not inclusive of, trips, bus rentals, admission fees, special projects, theater programs, enrichment activities, guest speakers, etc. All grants should foster the teaching of tolerance, diversity, equity, inclusivity and personal and group positive relations.

Estimated Range of Awards: Up to \$500

Ongoing / Rolling Basis

Opportunity: Lovett Fund for Elementary Drama

Due Date: Rolling basis, beginning in August of each school year

Eligible Applicants: Elementary Educators, 501c3s

Purpose: Funding is available for the production of plays and musicals performed by elementary school students (grades 1–5) in a school program.

Estimated Range of Awards: \$300

Opportunity: Team First Book Philadelphia

Due Date: The 1st of every month

Eligible Applicants: community-based mentoring, tutoring, and family literacy programs

Purpose: TFBP provides new books to children in need addressing one of the most important factors affecting literacy – access to books. TFBP supplies books to schools, after-school programs and other organizations that already have the tools to teach and use the books for lessons, and then the books go home with the kids so they can share the joy of reading with their family and friends. All books distributed by First Book are brand new and are provided at no cost to the child.

Grant Opportunities

Opportunity: Toshiba America Foundation

Due Date: Ongoing

Eligible Applicants: Teachers of grades 6-12

Purpose: Toshiba America Foundation (TAF) grants fund the projects ideas and materials teachers need to innovate in their Science, technology, engineering and math classrooms. TAF is interested in funding innovative projects designed by teachers or small teams of teachers for use in their own schools and classroom. Applications must be for project based learning.

They do not consider requests for computer hardware (including computers, laptops, and tablets). Summer programs, after-school projects, and independent study projects are not eligible for funding.

Estimated Range of Awards: Applications for less than \$5,000 are due 12/1, 3/1, 6/1 & 9/1. Applications for grants of more than \$5,000 are due 11/1 and 5/1.
