Upcoming Deadlines

Opportunity: Samull Classroom Herb Garden Grants

Due Date: October 15, 2024

Eligible Applicants: Elementary classrooms grades K-6 with ten students or more

Purpose: The Herb Society of America will select 15 elementary schools to receive \$300 to establish an indoor or outdoor herb garden. In addition to plants, the funds may be used for supplies such as soil, plant trays, containers, child or youth sized tools, etc.

Estimated Range of Awards: \$300

Opportunity: The Philly Service Award

Due Date: November, 2024

Eligible Applicants: Philadelphia High Schools

Purpose: At the Philly Service Award, our mission is to engage and inspire Philadelphia's youth by funding high schools with grants for student-led community service projects. By taking a hands-on approach to their communities' challenges, students are changing the city from the inside out while carving their own path to civic leadership. We celebrate their achievements at our awards ceremony, provide additional funding to enhance schools, and support educators with classroom essentials.

Estimated Range of Awards: \$1,000 grant for community service; supplies for school; additional future prizes available if selected to participate

Opportunity: Lorrie Otto Seeds for Education (SFE)

Due Date: November 15, 2024

Eligible Applicants: Schools, after-school care programs, or youth groups

Purpose: For more than 25 years, this vital Wild Ones donor-funded program has provided small grants for native plant gardens and landscaping projects throughout the United States. The funds are designated for acquiring native plants and seeds for outdoor learning areas that engage children, preschool to high school. Youth must participate directly in planning, planting and caring of the native plant gardens. Applicants encouraged to reach out to local Wild Ones chapter for additional support and resources.

Estimated Range of Awards: \$100-\$500

<u>Opportunity: Environmental Education Mini Grants</u> (REQUIRES OGD ASSISTANCE)

Due Date: November 15, 2024

Eligible Applicants: K-12 schools

Purpose: The PA Department of Environmental Protection is offering schools mini grants of up to \$5,000 to fund innovative environmental education projects. The goal of environmental education is an environmentally literate citizenry, prepared to make informed decisions and take positive actions to help ensure the state's natural resources are available for the use and enjoyment of future generations. Priority is given to environmental education projects that engage people living, working and/or attending school within Environmental Justice areas in topics related to Climate Change and/or Water.

Eligible costs include travel, resources such as educational materials, supplies, and equipment/technology, and staffing if they do not exceed 50% of grant funds. Involvement of partners is highly encouraged.

Matching Grant: Yes - A match of any amount is required (20% is encouraged). It can be cash and/or in-kind.

Estimated Range of Awards: \$5,000

<u>Opportunity: Karma for Cara Community Service</u> <u>Youth MicroGrant Program</u>

Due Date: October 1st, January 1st, April 1st, & July 1st

Eligible Applicants: Students 18 years of age and under. Must have a teacher/adult advisor for their project.

Purpose: Students may apply to complete service projects in their communities throughout the United States.

Estimated Range of Awards: between \$250-\$1,000

Note: They do not fund stipends, facility rentals, or transportation costs.

Opportunity: Leveling the Playing Field

Due Date: Rolling Basis

Eligible Applicants: K-12 schools and nonprofits serving economically

disadvantaged youth

Purpose: Leveling the Playing Field furnishes schools and community organizations with free new and gently-used sports equipment enabling those groups to provide affordable and accessible youth sports activities for their children who otherwise would not have such opportunities.

Estimated Range of Awards: Access to their warehouse space to take new and gently-used equipment on a continuous basis

Due Date: Ongoing

Eligible Applicants: Teachers of grades K-12

Purpose: Toshiba America Foundation (TAF) grants fund the projects ideas and materials teachers need to innovate in their science, technology, engineering and math classrooms. TAF is interested in funding innovative projects designed by teachers or small teams of teachers for use in their own schools and classroom. Applications must be for project based learning.

They do not consider requests for computer hardware (including computers, laptops, and tablets). Summer programs, after-school projects, and independent study projects are not eligible for funding.

Estimated Range of Awards:

GRADES K-5

Applications for less than \$5,000 are due 10/1.

GRADES 6-12

Applications for less than \$5,000 are due 9/1, 12/1, 3/1, &6/1 Applications for grants of more than \$5,000 are due 11/1 and 5/1.
