The essay must be 5 paragraphs, 12 pt. Times New Roman font, and double spaced. The essay will be graded according to the Keystone Expository Writing Guidelines.

11th Grade Assignment:

The common concepts of the 11th grade texts are family and familial relationships. Read one book from the list provided, and in a well-constructed essay, explore how the concept of family and familial relationships are conveyed in the text. The essay must be 3-5 pages, 12 pt. Times New Roman font, and double spaced. The essay will be graded according to the SAT Essay Scoring Rubric.

12th Grade Assignment:

The common concept of the 12th grade texts is power and the struggle for that power. Read one book from the list provided, and in a well-constructed essay, explore how the concept of power and the struggle for power conveyed in the text. The essay must be 3-5 pages, 12 pt. Times New Roman font, and double spaced. The essay will be graded according to the SAT Essay Scoring Rubric.
