#### WELCOME BACK TO THE HANCOCK SCHOOL!



We are practicing social distancing both outside and inside the Hancock School. Please make sure you follow all signage and follow all established procedures. All adults must complete a COVID Screener before they enter the Hancock School. Make sure you have a green check prior to entering.



You are cleared for entry into the building.

## Where does my child enter?

• Students in Rooms 215, 103 and 212 will arrive at the front entrance and be dropped off in the front of the car loop to exit their bus.



## Where does my child enter?

- Doors will not open until 8:30 AM.
- No students will be permitted to congregate in the yard before school. Students should not report to the yard until 8:30 AM.
- Students who arrive after 8:45 will be marked late.
- Students should line up at the designated space provided for their classroom, leaving the appropriate spacing between each student.



## Where does my child enter?

 Students in rooms 108, 109, 110, 105, 106, 107, 101, 102, and 202 should line up in the big school yard at the designated space provided for their classroom, leaving the appropriate spacing between each student.

## Where does my child exit?

Students in grades 3, 4, and 5 will dismiss at 3:09 PM. Rooms 202, 106, 105, 102, and 101 will exit through the Rainforest doors and line up to be dismissed from the school yard in their classroom line.

Students in grades 3, 4, and 5 will dismiss at 3:09 PM. Rooms 110,109,108, and 107 will exit through the Announcement doors and line up to be dismissed from the school yard in their classroom line.

## Routine COVID Testing

- Any student who will be participating in hybrid learning must have parent consent completed for the routine COVID-19 testing.
- Students who do not submit parent consent for testing WILL NOT be permitted to participate in hybrid learning.



## Breakfast, Lunch, & Recess

- Students will eat breakfast and lunch in their classrooms.
- All students will have recess.
- Recess will be held outside weather permitting.
- Students will be separated by classroom.
- Social distancing will be followed.



## Uniforms

#### Students may wear either their regular uniform or their Gym uniform.

- Regular uniform: Navy blue or white shirts with collars and navy blue or khaki slacks. Shirts must have collars. Girls may wear khaki slacks, knee length navy blue skirts, knee length navy blue skorts or jumpers if desired. Shorts are only permitted during the following months: September, October, April, May, and June. When shorts are appropriate, to the knees is the required length. No jeans, sleeveless tops or midriff tops are permitted. Leggings are not permitted as part of the Hancock uniform. Girls may wear navy or white stockings or leggings under their skirt if the weather is cold. When cold in the classroom, students may wear navy blue, white or khaki sweaters or crew neck sweatshirts over their uniform shirts. Hooded sweatshirts are not permitted.
- Gym uniform: Navy and/or gold t-shirts and navy sweatpants in cold weather, and navy and/or gold t-shirts and navy shorts or sweatpants in warm weather. Sneakers are required. \*Gym uniforms are permitted on all days during in-person Hybrid Learning.
- Logos are not permitted on clothing with the exception of Hancock or LaBrum School Logo clothing.
- Footwear may be shoes or sneakers. Light up sneakers and skate sneakers are not permitted. Shoes must have rubber soles. Sneakers are recommended footwear. No open toe shoes, or heels are permitted.
- All students should come to school clean and well-groomed. Good personal hygiene is practiced at home as well as in school.
- Please note that given the limits of special area class opportunities because of the hybrid model, students will have gym more frequently than usual.
