Vocabulary Building:

Computer Work:

Each report period students will be required to complete projects using a computer. If you do not have accessibility to a computer, the student needs to go the library or make arrangements with the computer teacher to work after school. On certain days my classroom will be available to work, but students must make arrangement prior to staying.

There will be assignments that should be completed on the computer at home. These programs will enhance your child's reading and math skills. Welcome to the 2019-2020 school year! I want to take this opportunity to introduce myself and express my excitement about working with your child this year. I love teaching math and science because I care deeply about each of my students. I believe students can grow and develop by examining the topics we cover in class. In Grade 8 Math, instructional time will focus on three critical areas: (1) formulating and reasoning about expressions and equations, including modeling an association in bivariate data with a linear equation, and solving linear equations and systems of linear equations; (2) grasping the concept of a function and using functions to describe quantitative relationships; (3) analyzing two- and three-dimensional space and figures using distance, angle, similarity, and congruence, and understanding and applying the Pythagorean Theorem. In addition to instruction in the eighth grade math curriculum, the students will spend 20-30 minutes each day working on any mathematical weaknesses they may have using an online program called I-Ready. More information will be given about this program at Back to School Night. In Science, we will focus on topics involving (1) matter; (2) classification, genetics, and evolutionary changes; (3) ecosystems.

Additional information about the class is provided in the syllabus that will be given to students on the first day of school. Please read that syllabus and sign the detachable portion on the bottom of the syllabus in order to indicate your understanding and support of the classroom system. There is also space provided for you to express any questions, concerns or comments. Students should return that portion to me.
