The parents, students, and staff of John B. Kelly School collaborated to develop this School-Parent Compact. - Decrease the number of students scoring in the below basic category on the PSSA-Math assessment. No more than 20% of 3rd-5th grade students will score Below Basic.
- Decrease the number of students scoring in the below basic category on the PSSA-English Language Arts assessment. No More than 25% of 3rd-5th grade students will score Below Basic.

SCHOOL/TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES:

John B. Kelly will:

1. Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment. We review Lexia, iReady and benchmark scores in meetings amongst grades in order to plan small group instruction to meet the needs of the students in our classrooms.

- Teachers conduct small groups in both math and literacy using classroom data including Aimsweb and DRA's. ELA teachers also provide guided reading instruction to all students.
- 2. Communicate with parents frequently through Class Dojo, monthly newsletters, school messenger, the school's website and provide quarterly progress reports
- 3. Provide opportunities for parents to volunteer and participate in school activities
- 4. Host Family Literacy/Math Night events where families will receive strategies for at-home activities

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

We, as parents, will:

- Ensure my child arrives to school on time and attends school every day
- Ensure that homework is completed daily
- Participate in decisions relating to my child's education
- Promote positive use of my child's extracurricular time
- Stay informed about my child's education and communicate with the school by promptly reading and responding to all notices from the school
- Attend parent meetings and school related activities

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Arrive on time and be prepared to participate in lessons
- Follow school rules and demonstrate "CPRK"
- Complete daily homework assignments
- Read for at least 30 minutes every day outside of school
- Take home all notices and information received from school every day
- Be responsible for school equipment

John B. Kelly is committed to frequent two-way communication with families about children's learning. Some of the ways you can expect us to reach you are:

JB Kelly provides academic information to parents through Class Dojo. Monthly
calendars are sent home to ensure parents have up-to-date event and academic
information. Newsletters are used to highlight student achievement and share important
resource information to parents/guardians. Robo calls are used to send reminders about
attendance, scholl events, early dismissals, and academic and testing information.
The School website is utilized to provide up-to-date communication with parents and
parent teacher conferences enable parents to work with teachers to ensure academic
success.
