Thanks to all of our teachers and staff who are pushing our students to think and struggle through Reading and Math. It's through productive struggle that students learn! Tests will be more rigorous so please be sure to help students at home. ✤ 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students – PSSA's are from April 23rd to May 3rd. Please plan on being in school.

 Know your child's reading level and make sure they are making progress.

Every child should have access to the Reading and Math interventions so that they can work on this at home

✤ Please be sure students are here on time every day – the percentage of students who attend 95% or better in each grade are as follows:

- KG 47.1%
- 1st grade 55.2%
- 2nd grade 57.5%
- 3rd grade 64.2%
- 4th grade 64.8%
- 5th grade 65.5%

You play the most important role in making sure your child is here on time. We want them to learn and they can't do that if they miss days here and there.

Important Reminders

- The last day of school is June 4th. Please do not plan to leave before June 4th as you will not receive a report card. It is important for children to be in school until the last day.
- ✓ Many students are coming late to school. It is very important that students line up by 8:10 am. Please teach students the importance of being on time whether it's rainining, snowing, or bright outside. When students are late, it disrupts their day.
- Fire drills have to be done monthly no matter how cold it is. We are not allowed to take our jackets because we have to exit quickly. Safety first!
- ✓ Always bring your photo ID to pick up children. No exception!
