GENERAL INFORMATION

The Julia R. Masterman Laboratory and Demonstration School is a public, academic magnet school located in the city of Philadelphia. Students from all sections of the city may apply, and are admitted based on highly selective requirements for standardized testing, grades, attendance, and behavior. The school serves approximately 1200 students in grades five through twelve; there are roughly 800 students in the middle school and 400 students in the high school. Students enter Masterman Middle School in fifth or sixth grade and must apply to the High School when they are in eighth grade. The student population is diverse ethnically, racially, and socioeconomically. The ethnic/racial composition of the high school is 39% White/Caucasian, 29% Asian, 16% Black/African-American, 1% Hispanic, 10% Other and 5% Not Indicated.

CURRICULUM

All students follow a college preparatory program. As of fall 2016, all courses are offered at the Honors or Advanced Placement (AP) levels only.* AP courses include:

Biology Calculus AB Calculus BC Chemistry English Language & Composition **English Literature & Composition**

French Language & Culture Music Theory Physics Spanish Language & Culture Statistics **U.S. Government and Politics** U.S. History

Juniors may take a maximum of two AP courses. Seniors may take a maximum of three AP Courses.

*Please note, an Advanced designation in previous years is the equivalent of the current Honors designation.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

3 credits of Science

Students must also complete a Senior Project.

ENRICHMENT COURSES

Students can elect to take Enrichment Courses during their lunch period and/or after school. Various seminars are offered, such as: Architecture, Debate, Music Composition, Oncology, Photoshop, Software Development, ACT & SAT Test Prep, etc.

GRADE POINT AVERAGE

Grade Point Average (GPA) is calculated at the end of each school year using final grades and includes all classes. Weighted and unweighted GPAs are reported on the transcript. Honors classes carry a weight of 1.15 and AP classes carry a weight of 1.2.

Masterman does not rank students. All students take college preparatory classes and typically 100% of the graduates attend four-year colleges.
