IB SUMMATIVE - ASSESSMENT HIGHLIGHTS



The sixth graders recently just finished reading "Hatchet." While reading, they analyzed different turning points the character made and how perspectives can change throughout a story. After reading, the students became newspaper reporters and "interviewed" Brian from "Hatchet" to find out how Brian's perspective changed throughout the story. The students then wrote a newspaper article that described Brian's attitudes and beliefs at the start of the book and explained how those attitudes and beliefs changed by the end. The sixth graders enjoyed writing these articles and discovering how people's perspectives can change by simple events.
