Dear Parents and Guardians,

From implementing Academic Parent Teacher Teams, Morning Meetings, and Restorative Circles to partnering with dozen of organizations, we are committed to grow McClure as a hub for neighbors and families as well as students. Recently we took another step forward by applying to become a Community School under the Mayor's Office of Education (MOE). As a Community School, the MOE would provide us with a full-time Community School Coordinator; we would be able to greatly expand our reach, offering services, resources, and opportunities to parents and neighbors as well as students (for example, a nearby Community School has a bank for free professional clothes and recently hosted a writing workshop with Philadelphia's Poet Laureate).

Last Friday, we hosted two MOE and SDP representatives for a site visit and interview at McClure. Over 25 parents, staff, and community partners took the time to participate; we want to thank everyone who attended for contributing to the constructive and inspiring conversation that we were able to hold. Ms. Sanchez, Ms. Amaro, Ms. Johnson, Ms. Aisha, Ms. Howard, Ms. Gil, Ms. Connie, and Ms. Parham all spoke eloquently to the ways in which McClure could flourish as a Community School, while representatives from City Year, the Lenfest Center, the Office of Councilwoman Maria Quiñones-Sanchez, COSACOSA, Esperanza Academy, and others spoke to the growth we are making with our partners. We also want to thank Ms. Boschen and her students, who demonstrated a Morning Meeting for the MOE visitors

From attending conferences and APTT meetings, to chaperoning field trips, to attending SAC and Title 1 meetings, and helping your child with their homework, we could not have gotten this far without you, McClure families, we have our fingers crossed that we will be selected to enter the 2019-2020 school year as a Community School; either way, we are so proud of the progress we have made together.
