- 100% of Kindergarten, 1st, and 2nd grade students will demonstrate one year of growth through a comparison of Q1 and Q4 independent reading levels.
- At least 24% of students will score at Proficient or Advanced on the Math PSSA.
- At least 40% of 3rd grade students will score at Proficient or Advanced on the ELA PSSA.

 At least 36% of students will score at Proficient or Advanced on the ELA PSSA.

<u>SCHOOL/TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES:</u>

John Moffet School will:

- Moffet School provides rigorous, high-quality instruction based on the State standards, as
 implemented through the School District's Core Curriculum and related materials. The
 Instructional Models for Literacy, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies enable teachers to
 teach to proficiency, while allowing for differentiation and interventions strategies and
 techniques. Moffet's use of technology bolsters the academic curriculum with software relating to
 both literacy and math skills. We offer specific programs to build the achievement of all students;
 these include Lexia & Achieve 3000 for literacy and I- Ready for math. We also have Reading
 Mastery and Corrective Reading to provide additional support to our students in need of
 intensive interventions. Overall, Moffet School has a structured and effective learning
 environment for all students with the goal of improved and successful academic achievement.
- The Moffet School will hold Parent Teacher Report Card Conference on November 18th- 20th February 3rd-5th, and April 14th- 16th
- Moffet School will provide reports to parents regarding student progress in several ways. First, parents will receive report cards indicating student achievement in November, February, April and June. Second, teachers will send home interim reports notifying parents of ongoing progress made by their children and of any problems or difficulties that their children may be experiencing. Third, in cases that are deemed necessary, students may receive daily reports from teachers relaying information concerning academic progress and/or behavioral issues. Finally, teachers will communicate to parents via notes and phone calls as they see fit on an ongoing basis.
- Moffet School ensures that parents are always welcome to meet with their children's teacher. In addition to the official report card conferences, parents may always call the office to set up an appointment to come in and meet their child's teacher. Teachers also reach out to parents and meet with them before/after school or during their preparation times.
- Parents are always welcomed and encouraged to come to Moffet to volunteer. Parents are encouraged to contact the Teacher Leader who will ensure they have the necessary clearances and prepare a schedule to volunteer in the school.

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES:
