Applications are being accepted February 6, 2018 - February 28, 2018.



Students enrolled in S.Y.O.P. spend up to five days on a college campus or several days a week at a training facility, learning real-world 21st-century technical skills and earning industry certifications. The Senior Year Only Program is a full school year commitment. Lunch and transportation are provided.

ELIGIBILITY

- Every student who will earn at least 15.5 quality credits by the end of junior year is eligible to apply. Quality credits include 3 English credits, 3 Math credits, 2 Science credits, 2 Social Studies credits, 2 World Language credits, 1 Physical Education credit, 2 Elective credits, and .5 Health credits.
- Advanced Senior Year participants must obtain a qualifying score on the Accuplacer Exam
- Temple Education Scholars participants must have a 3.25 GPA or higher through their junior year of high school

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Who is eligible to apply for S.Y.O.P.?

Students need a minimum of 15.5 quality credits by the end of their Junior year to qualify for S.Y.O.P. However, 17.5 quality credits are required to begin the program in the fall. Students who are missing a maximum of two core credits (English, Math, Science or Social Studies) can successfully complete credit recovery over the summer to be considered for program participation.

What if I will not have 17.5 credits by fall 2018?

Students who do not have 17.5 credits by the start of their senior year will not be able to participate in the program.

Can I apply to more than one program?

Yes. Students can apply for multiple programs by ranking preferences on the application.

What is the minimum GPA for S.Y.O.P.?

The Temple Education Scholars program requires a 3.25 GPA. Other S.Y.O.P. programming does not require a minimum GPA.

What are the requirements to apply for S.Y.O.P.?

Completed application - including written responses to the short answer questions - and a copy of your credit profile.

When are S.Y.O.P. applications due?

All applications are due on February 28, 2018. Late applications will not be accepted!

When will I know if I am admitted into S.Y.O.P.?

Selected applicants will be notified in April 2018.

Is there a cost for S.Y.O.P.?



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

S.Y.O.P. is free of charge for students! Students will receive transportation, lunch, and necessary books/materials for all programs.

Where will S.Y.O.P. take place?

- ASY will take place at CCP main campus 1700 Spring Garden Street, 19130.
- Private Pilot will take place at the Northeast Airport 9800 Ashton Road, 19114.
- Enhanced Vocational Internship Program (EVIP) will take place at the Finishing Trades Institute -2190 Hornig Road, 19116.
- Urban Agriculture will take place at Fox Chase Farm 8500 Pine Street, 19111.
- Temple Education Scholars will take place at Temple University 1801 N. Broad Street, 19122.
- Comcast Internship Program various locations throughout the city.

What certificates/license/college credits will I receive?

- Students in ASY can receive up to 24 college credits.
- Students in Private Pilot program will receive an official pilot license.
- Students in the EVIP program will receive 6 industry certifications and 30 transferable college credits from Mountwest Community College.
- Students in the Urban Agriculture Program will receive the following: OSHA 10, ServSafe, PA
 Pesticide Applicator's License, and STIHL Landscaping Equipment Use Training Certification
- Students in the Temple Education Scholars program will receive up to 15 college credits.

How many days a week will S.Y.O.P. take place?

- ASY: Students will attend five full days per week.
- Private Pilot program: Students will attend two full days on site, three full days at school.
- EVIP: Student will attend four full days on site, one full day at school.
- Urban Agriculture: Students will attend two full days on site, three full days at school.
- Temple Education Scholars: Students will attend school everyday and two or three afternoons per week on site.
- Comcast Internship Program: Students will attend 1 full day on site, 4 full days at school.

Are there medical requirements for the Private Pilot Program?

Students applying to the Private Pilot program will be required to take and pass an intensive FAA certified medical examination.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

I have applied for a S.Y.O.P. program. What are my next steps?

Applications will be reviewed and students will receive official notification of next steps via email. Next steps vary depending on your program.

- Private Pilot Program: Students will be required to take and pass an intensive FAA certified medical examination.
- ASY Program: Students will receive instructions on how to schedule and take the Accuplacer exam.
 Students must place into college level courses in both Math and English to be eligible for ASY.
- All Other Programs: Students will be invited to participate in an interview.

What are the start and end dates of each program?

S.Y.O.P. is a full school year commitment.

- ASY: Summer 2018 June 2019
- Private Pilot: September 2018 June 2019
- EVIP: September 2018 June 2019
- Urban Agriculture: September 2018 June 2019
- Temple Education Scholars: August 2018 June 2019
- Comcast Internship Program: September 2018 2019
