



The District-Wide Survey is one of SDP's best tools for assessing different perspectives across topics. The surveys collect feedback from parents, students, and teachers. Most survey questions relate to one of five topics important to school improvement: Climate, Instruction, Leadership, Professional Capacity, or Parent/Guardian Community Ties. The more positive the feedback received, the higher the "score." The highest score for each topic is 10, which would mean that everyone who responded selected the most positive choices for all questions about that topic.


