Dear Parents / Guardians,

I am excited to announce that we have partnered with PHMC Health Network to bring COVID-19 vaccines to you, your children and family. The Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine is now available to anyone 12 years and older and is administered in two doses, three weeks apart.

This is an opportunity for you, your children and family members to be vaccinated right in your own school community.
