Section A: JOINTLY DEVELOPED

<u>Joseph Pennell School</u> will take the following actions to involve parents in an organized, ongoing, and timely manner in the planning, review, and improvement of Title I programs, including opportunities for regular meetings, if requested by parents, to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their child and respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible. The school will:

- SAC members, parents/parent volunteers, and community members will meet in the Spring to conduct a review and needs assessment on parental involvement, the Parent and Family Engagement Policy and School-Parent Compact. The input and feedback will help determine how the school can budget for additional needs and activities for the school year. This Policy and the School-Parent Compact were jointly developed with parents using input from the annual Spring Title I parent meeting held on April 22, 2020.

Section B: ANNUAL TITLE I MEETING

<u>Joseph Pennell School</u> will take the following actions to conduct an annual meeting, at a convenient time, and encourage and invite all parents of participating children to attend to inform them about the school's Title I program, the nature of the Title I program, the parents' requirements, the school parent and family engagement policy, the schoolwide plan, and the school-parent compact. - In the Fall of 2020, the school will hold the Annual Title I meeting during Back to School Night. - The parents will be invited to the meeting via calendar, flyer, and school messenger.

- All communication from the school is sent to parents in easy-to-read language and in the languages spoken at home as requested. The Office of Family and Community Engagement is able to support the school in translating documents and telephone communication with non-English speaking parents upon request.

Principal will share the budget with parents at the Spring and Winter Title I Parent Input meeting (This year's meeting was held on January 9, 2020). Parents will have an opportunity at the Winter meeting to provide input on how the school will spend Title I funds, including the 1% parent involvement funds. Historically, the school has decided, with parent input, to spend parent funds on the position of School Improvement Support Liaison to assist parents and provide better home and school connection.

 Literacy and Math workshop, School Selection Process, Preparing for the PSSA, etc., based on parents' input of what workshops they would like to see.
 - During the monthly SAC meetings, the Principal will allow parents to bring any issues or concerns that they would like to discuss.
 - During Back To School Night, the Principal will provide information about the State's and local academic standards and assessments, the requirements of Title I, Part A, and also learn how to monitor their child's progress. Parents will be invited to parent workshops and learn how to work along with educators, about parents rights under Title I, the state academic content standards and assessments, and the school curriculum.
 - Topics a) through e) listed above are covered in a powerpoint presentation that staff will present to parents as part of our Annual Title I Parent Meeting at back to school night.

Section H: BUILDING CAPACITY OF SCHOOL STAFF

<u>Joseph Pennell School</u> will provide training to educate teachers, specialized instructional support personnel, principals, and other school leaders, and other staff, with the assistance of parents, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, implement and coordinate parent programs, and build ties between parents and the school by:

- The school will provide PD to staff to review appropriate and effective parental communication expectations at a district PD day in the Fall. Results of parent surveys will also be incorporated into this PD to inform decision making about the development of parent engagement activities and protocols.
- Provide staff with training on and access to platforms such as Class Dojo that allow for a school wide effort to communicate with parents.
