#### Within-year Student Enrollment Trends, 2017-2018

This brief presents a summary of within-year enrollment trends for 202,088 students whose first school of record in 2017-2018 was a District, Charter, or Renaissance Charter<sup>1</sup> school. A student's first school of record occurs when they enroll in a school for at least 10 days, whether it is at the beginning of the school year or anytime thereafter.

#### **Research Questions**

Three research questions were examined for students attending District, Charter, and Renaissance Charter schools:

- 1. What percentage of students stayed and left their initial school of record during the 2017-2018 school year? What percentage of students moved once? What percentage of students moved two or more times?
- 2. Are there differences in within-year student movement by grade?
- 3. What month during the year do students leave their initial school of record, and are there differences by school type?

#### **Methods**

To answer these research questions, students were grouped into three categories based on the type of school they were first enrolled in during the 2017-2018 school year. Students were included in the sample if they were enrolled in a school for at least 10 days, regardless of when the initial enrollment began.

The three categories that comprise the sample are: students who started in a District school, students who started in a Charter school, and students who started in a Renaissance Charter school.<sup>2</sup> Students were then further categorized into four groupings for analyses:

- Students who finished the year at their initial school,
- Students who left the sample completely (i.e. exited their initial school and did not immediately enroll in a District, Charter or Renaissance Charter school for at least 10 days),<sup>3</sup>

- Students who moved once during the year to a District, Charter, or Renaissance Charter school, and
- Students who moved two or more times during the year and all of the schools were either a District, Charter, or Renaissance Charter school.

#### **Findings**

## 1. Within-year student enrollment trends were similar regardless of initial school of record; students stayed and left their initial school at similar rates

Across school types (District, Charter, and Renaissance Charter), there was little variation in the percentage of students that fell into each category. Approximately 90% of students in District schools, 94% of students in Charter schools, and 88% of students in Renaissance Charter schools did not change schools during the 2017-2018 school year. When students left their initial school during the 2017-18 school year, they also left at similar rates across the type of initial school of record: about 4% of students in District schools, 2% of students in Charter schools, and 5% of students in Renaissance Charter schools left the sample (District or Charter schools) entirely. The percent of students moving to one other school was 4% of District students, 2% of Charter students, and 3% of Renaissance Charter students. The percentage of students moving two or more times was consistently low (<1%) across school types as well (Table 1).

## 2. Within-year student enrollment trends varied by grade level across initial school types

For each of the three initial school types (District, Charter, and Renaissance Charter schools), we next examined within-year student enrollment trends. The grades with the highest and lowest percentage of students completing the year at the same school for those initially enrolled in a District school were twelfth (95%) and ninth (89%) (Table 2). For students initially enrolled in a Charter school, the grade with the lowest percentage of students finishing the year at the same school was also ninth (93%), and the grades with the highest percentage of students who did not move were Kindergarten, third, and fourth (98%) (Table 3). Third and fourth graders at Renaissance Charters also had the highest percentage of students completing the year at their initial school (96%), with eleventh graders showing the lowest percentage (81%) (Table 4).

# 3. Monthly trends of student exit were similar across school types; for all school types the month with the highest percentage of students leaving was October

To examine the number and percentage of students exiting schools each month, exit codes were grouped by month and initial school of record. All exit codes were included in this analyses. Across all three school types, the data indicate that the highest percentage of students that exited their initial school of record did so in October. It is possible that this is the result of the administrative catch-up that takes place each year by October 1 so that administrative records accurately reflect the current year's enrollment. The next highest percentage left in January (15.7% of students who left after starting in a District school) and in November (15.4% of students who left after starting in a Charter school). For students starting the year in a Renaissance Charter, 13.7% of those who exited left in both November and January (Table 5).
