COMPARING PERSPECTIVES on RESPECT

1. Do students treat each other with respect?

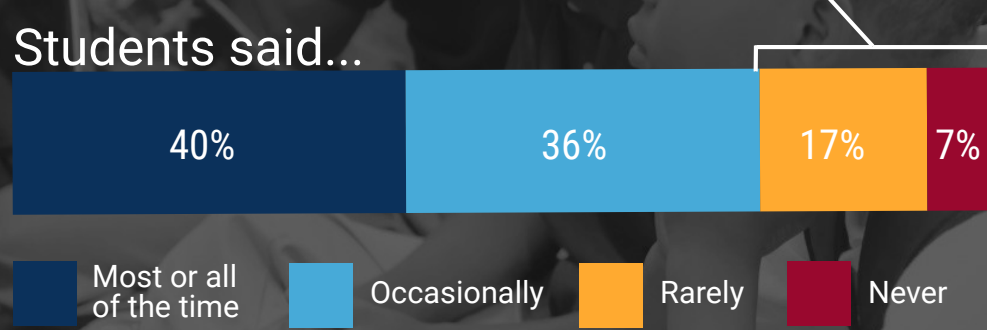
We asked teachers...

How often is this true?
"My students treat each other with respect."

We asked students...

How often is this true?
"I am treated with respect by other students."

Survey item: How often is this true? "My students treat each other with respect."/"I am treated with respect by other students." Results are based on responses from 6,663 teachers and 89,331 students.



Almost 1 in 4 students (24%) said other students "rarely" or "never" treat them with respect.

The survey said...

While about 6 in 10 teachers (61%) said students treat each other with respect "most or all of the time," only 4 in 10 students (40%) said the same about their peers-- and almost a quarter of students (24%) said other students "rarely" or "never" treat them with respect.

2. Do adults treat students with respect?

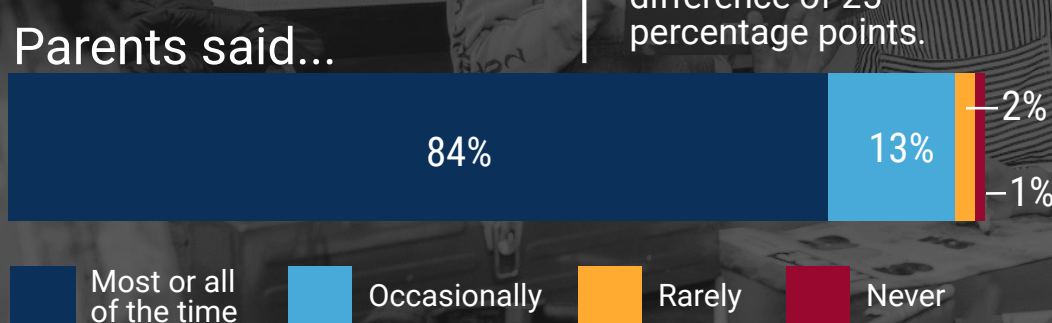
We asked students...

How often is this true?
"My teachers treat me with respect."

We asked parents...

How often is this true?
"Adults at school treat my child with respect."

Survey item: How often is this true? "My teachers treat me with respect."/"Adults at school treat my child with respect." Results are based on responses from 89,331 students and 35,020 parents/guardians.



Most parents said adults at school treat students with respect "most or all of the time." Only 59% of students agreed—a difference of 25 percentage points.

The survey said...

More parents said adults treat their child with respect "most or all of the time" compared to the percentage of students who said the same. While only 3% of parents and guardians reported that adults "rarely" or "never" treat their child with respect, 14% of students said that teachers treat them with respect "rarely" or "never."

3. Do adults feel respected by students?

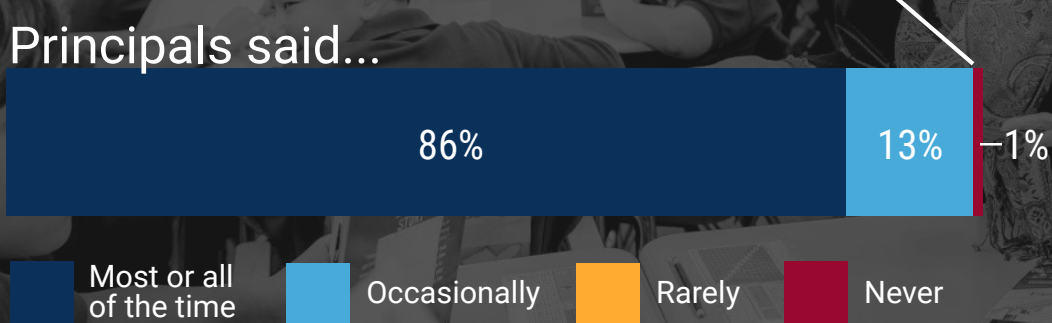
We asked teachers...

Do you agree or disagree?
"I feel respected by students."

We asked principals...

Do you agree or disagree?
"I feel respected by students."

Survey item: Do you agree or disagree? "I feel respected by students." Results are based on responses from 6,663 teachers and 185 principals.



While most teachers and principals said they feel respected "most or all of the time," 9% of teachers said they "rarely" or "never" felt respected, compared to only 1% of principals.

The survey said...

Almost 9 in 10 principals said that they feel "a great deal" respected, and about 6 in 10 teachers said the same. Very few teachers and principals (1% and 2%, respectively) said they "never" feel respected by students.
