# 1. Do students feel safe going to and from school?

We asked parents...


How often does your child feel safe going to and from school?

Survey item: How often is this true? "I feel safe going to and from school."/"My child feels safe going to and from school." Results are based on responses from 89,331 students and 35,020 parents/guardians.

## While 82% of parents said

The survey said...

their child feels safe traveling to and from school most or all of the time, only 54% of students agreed---and almost one in five said they "rarely" or "never" feel safe at these times.

We asked students how safe they felt in classrooms, hallways, and bathrooms at their school. While 84% of parents and guardians reported that

their child felt safe at school most or all of the time, only 68% of students said they felt safe in their classrooms most or all of the time-and that percentage dropped by 7 points in hallways and 20 points in bathrooms.

Looking closer...

The large green circle represents all students who responded to the survey.

## 39% (represented by the uncovered green section) said they felt safe **most or all of the time** in classrooms, hallways, and bathrooms at school. The smaller circle represents the 61% of respondents who said there was at least one

school location where they did not always feel safe. Of those students... ...44% said they never, rarely, ...30% said there was one


### We asked teachers and principals to rate the level of challenge at their school.

Survey item: How much of a challenge is school crime / safety? Results are based on responses from 6,663 teachers and 185 principals.

## The survey said... Compared to the percentage

of principals, a higher percentage

of teachers said that school crime / safety is "not a challenge" at school (25% versus 39%, respectively).

The surveys measure five key topics: Climate, Instruction, Professional Capacity, Leadership, and Parent & Guardian Community Ties.
