Goal 4: College and Career (Grades 9-11)

Goal 4: The percentage of students who are proficient on all three state high school assessments (Algebra, Literature, and Biology) by the end of their 11th grade year will grow from 26.1% in August 2019 to 52.0% by August 2026. Target 2021-22: 31.7%

<u>Indicator 4.1</u>: The percentage of students in grades 9-11 who score at or above grade level on the District's within-year math and reading assessments.


Target 2021-22: 37.3%

<u>Indicator 4.2</u>: The percentage of students who are proficient on all three Keystones by the end of their 10th grade year. **Target 2021-22: 27.3**%

Goal 5: CTE and NOCTI

Goal 5: The percentage of CTE students who pass an industry standards-based competency assessment (NOCTI) by the end of their 12th grade year will grow from 49.9% in August 2019 to 80.0% in August 2026. Target 2021-22: 60.0%


The percentage of students in grade 11 who are passing their Level 2 Career and Technical course (with a grade of A or B). **Target 2021-22: 66.7**%

Graduation Rate Metrics at SDP

- On-time, 5th and 6th year
- SDP, SDP+Alternative, SDP+Alternative+Charter
- District vs. School level, attribution business rules

Four-Year Graduation Rate Definition

numerator

Number of Graduates

Number of students from the same ninth-grade cohort (in school year X-4) who received a diploma in or before the target year (school year X)

Four-Year Graduation Rate

denominator

Number of Students in Cohort

Number of students who entered ninth grade for the first time in school year X-4

School year X refers to the **four-year graduation target year**. School year X-4 refers to the **first-time ninth-grade cohort year**.

SDP Four-Year Graduation Rate Calculation

Number of Graduates

numerator

Number of students from the same ninth-grade cohort (in school year X-4; adjusted according to definition in denominator) who received a diploma in or before the target year (school year X) including early graduates and summer graduates (as of September 30) and excluding students who received GED diplomas

School District of Philadelphia Four-Year Graduation Rate

Number of Students in Cohort

Number of students who entered ninth grade for the first time in school year X-4


denominator

the number of students assigned to this cohort who enrolled after ninth grade

students who are hospitalized, deceased, or who transferred outside of the District

School year X refers to the **four-year graduation target year**. School year X-4 refers to the **first-time ninth-grade cohort year**.


Graduation Rates in Philadelphia, Last 3 Years

Graduation Rates by Race/Ethnicity





- School Graduation Rates

This longitudinal open data file includes information about the graduation rates for schools broken out by: graduation rate type (four-year, five-year, or six-year), demographic category (EL status, IEP status, Economically Disadvantaged Status, Gender, or Ethnicity), and ninth-grade cohort. Students are attributed to the last school at which they actively attended in the respective graduation window, which ends on September 30 each year. Students are classified as EL, as having an IEP, and/or economically disadvantaged if they were designated as such at any point during their high school career.

This file includes information for all ninth-grade cohorts dating back to the 2010-2011 ninth grade cohort. Previously published graduation Open Data files for earlier cohorts can be found in the Zip file archive. Note: this data does not include Chatter Schools.

Part 2: 9th Grade On-Track

Graduation Requirements

To graduate, SDP students must earn at least 23.5 credits (a typical one-year course is worth 1 credit), and a senior project.

They must also satisfy the following subject requirements:

- English (4 credits)
- Math (3 credits)
- Science (3 credits)
- Social Studies (3 credits)
 - Plus African American History (1 credit)
- Arts and Humanities (2 credits)
- World Language (2 credits)
- Physical Education (1 credit)
- Health Education (0.5 credits)
- Electives* (4 credits)

In 2003, Chicago Public Schools adopted the following metric for 9th grade success:

Freshman OnTrack:

A student is on track if he or she fails no more than one semester of a core course and earns at least 5 credits by the end of freshman year.


SDP's 9th Grade On-Track Definition

4 Core + 1 More = 9th Grade On-Track

A first-time 9th grader in SDP is considered On Track if he or she earns at least one credit in each of four core areas (English, math, science and social studies), plus one additional credit from any source.

Graduation Rates For On- and Off-Track Students



9th Grade On-Track and PERC

- Collaborated with Philadelphia Education Research Consortium (PERC) to expand our understanding of 9GOT in Philadelphia
 - Identifying middle-grades predictors of finishing 9th grade on track
 - Understanding patterns and trends in On-Track rates across the city
 - Connecting 9th grade attendance and On-Track status


9th Grade On-Track Status: Recent Trends



Firmly On-Track

- Students are further characterized as *Firmly On Track* if they have grades of A or B in each of their 5 On-Track courses
- Provides a useful metric of students who are not only likely to graduate in 4 years, but are also demonstrating affirmative academic achievement
 - 9th grade course marks are associated with final GPA...
 - Which in turn is associated with postsecondary matriculation and persistence

9th Grade On-Track Status: Recent Trends



What about attendance?

- Yes! 9th grade attendance is another predictor of graduation rates - and an important data point that SDP tracks closely
- Grades and attendance both matter (though grades are consistently the stronger predictor of the two)





The interplay of grades and attendance is also evident when we look at what happens after 9th grade.

- Most On-Track 9th graders graduate on time - but what about those who do not?
- 9th grade course marks and attendance can help us identify students who might fall off track as 10th graders



Part 3: CTE Participation and Graduation Rates

What is CTE?

CTE stands for Career and Technical Education

- Students take a series of courses that prepare them for a career in one of 40+ occupational areas
- The prototypical program starts in 10th grade, and continues through 11th and 12th grades (though some programs vary from this pacing)
- Many CTE students have the opportunity to take a program-specific exam, which provides a career-relevant credential (NOCTI or NIMS)


CTE Schools and Programs

- There are five comprehensive CTE schools
 - Students must apply to attend
 - All students enroll in a CTE program
- There are also 20+ additional high schools that offer one or more CTE programs which students may choose to pursue
- For a typical first-time 9th grade cohort, roughly 1 in 4 students will "touch"
 CTE at some point during their high school career...
 - And roughly 1 in 6 will be eligible to take the NOCTI/NIMS exams

Our research consistently shows that participation in CTE is associated with higher graduation rates

Graduation rates escalate for all students with each successive year.

This escalation is most pronounced for CTE Program students.



Why are CTE students more likely to graduate on time?

- Does CTE attract students with higher prior achievement or attendance?
 - Not supported by baseline data. On average, CTE students have, if anything, lower prior grades, test scores and attendance (though not dramatically)
- Does CTE participation still have a relationship to graduation rates after controlling for other factors known to be associated with graduation rates?

- Participation in CTE is associated with higher graduation rates
- This association is found even when a variety of student characteristics are controlled for
- And has been replicated with multiple graduating cohorts*
