





Key Terms

Goals & Guardrails

Key indicators of student achievement and school climate, established and monitored by the Board of Education

District schools

Schools that are operated by the School District of Philadelphia

Charter schools

Schools that are operated by external providers that are authorized by the Board of Education

Alternative Education programs

Programs that serve students who are not succeeding in the traditional school sector (typically those who are overage and undercredited). Some of these programs are run by the District, and some are run by external providers.

Key Terms

Metric

A measure of how schools are doing in a specific area

Framework

A report summarizing performance on a group of metrics

SPREE

School Progress Report on Education and Equity, the framework for District and Charter schools



School Progress Report, the predecessor to the SPREE



The SPREE released for SY2020-21, which contained fewer metrics

AEPR

Alternative Education Progress Report, the framework for alternative education programs

Accountability reports are part of an improvement cycle



History of Accountability Reports in SDP

Note: The results for each school year are typically published in the spring following that school year. For example, the 2012-13 SPR results were published in Spring 2014.

What is the AEPR?


The <u>Alternative Education Progress Report (AEPR)</u> is the District's accountability report to summarize alternative education program performance.

- Released each year for the previous school year for most alternative education programs
- Aligned to metrics and expectations outlined in the 2017-2022 program contracts
 - Supports Opportunity Network's program expansion/closure decisions (in conjunction with operational & instructional walkthroughs)
- * NEW AEPR * New 2022-2027 contracts began July 2022
 - Framework under revision to align with updated metrics and targets (closely aligned with Goals and Guardrails)

What is the SPREE?

The <u>School Progress Report on Education and Equity (SPREE)</u> is the District's accountability report for traditional District and Charter schools to summarize school performance and progress

- Closely aligned to the Board of Education's Goals and Guardrails
- Released each year for the previous school year
- Schools can receive both a high school report and a K8 report
- Explicitly incorporates equity through:
 - Measures of access and opportunity
 - Many metrics broken out for student groups served
 - School scored on its performance in serving all students and for each student group

Guardrail 1: Every school will be a safe, welcoming and healthy place where our students, staff and community want to be and learn each day. This means that our schools will be: 1) environmentally safe and clean; and 2) spaces with inclusive climates that provide students with access to robust social, emotional, and mental health supports.





SPREE Structure

The SPREE has four domains aligned to the Board's Goals and Guardrails:

- Student attendance (90%+ and 95%+)
- Out-of-school suspensions

Informational Only

- **Guardrail 4:** Suspension disproportionality
- **Guardrail 2:** Behavioral and mental health staff ratio
- **Guardrail 3**: SAC information
- Teacher attendance, retention, and evaluation information
- <u>Guardrail 2</u>: Student participation in visual and performing arts courses (non-HS)
- <u>Guardrail 4:</u> Whether groups of students are qualified to attend special admission high schools (K-8 and MS)
- Access to college-ready coursework (HS)
- Pending data: Guardrail 2: Student participation in co-curricular activities and athletics (HS)




Metric Scoring

Metric tiers based on performance against annual targets & improvement over time

- Meeting and Improving: At or above the annual target for the current year and showing sufficient improvement from previous year
- Meeting but Not Improving: At or above the annual target for the current year but not showing sufficient improvement from previous year
- Not Meeting but Improving: Below annual target for the current year but showing sufficient improvement from previous year
- Not Meeting and Not Improving: Below annual target for the current year and not showing sufficient improvement from previous year






SPREE Score Level Distribution, SY2021-2022



SPREE - Goal 1, SY2021-2022


Goal 1: The percentage of students in grades 3-8 who are proficient on the state ELA assessment will grow from 35.7% in August 2019 to 65.0% by August 2026.






SPREE - Goal 3, SY2021-2022


Goal 3: The percentage of students in grades 3-8 who are proficient on the state Math assessment will grow from 21.6% in August 2019 to 52.0% by August 2026.






SPREE - Goal 4, SY2021-2022


Goal 4: The percentage of students who are proficient on all three state high school assessments (Algebra, Literature, and Biology) by the end of their 11th grade year will grow from 26.1% in August 2019 to 52.0% by August 2026.






SPREE - Goal 5, SY2021-2022

Goal 5: The percentage of Career and Technical Education (CTE) students who pass an industry standards-based competency assessment by the end of their 12th grade year will grow from 54.5% in August 2019 to 80.0% in August 2026.
