

Open Data

The School District of Philadelphia (SDP), in partnership with Open Data Philly, publishes longitudinal data sets spanning various operational school and student performance areas. The public release of this data supports our goals to promote greater transparency and community engagement. Before accessing these data, please review the Torms and Conditions.

School- and Network-level enrollment data and performance on key indicators are also available on our interactive, user-friendly School Profiles website. In addition to district provided data, please visit the state report card, Future Ready Index, Ye additional metrics.

To date, SDP has released data sets for:

Part I: About the YRBS



Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System (YRBSS)



- Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)
- Monitors health-related behaviors
- Only survey of its kind—very important data source
- Conducted in cities and states across the U.S.
 - Every two years (odd years)
 - Anonymous and voluntary
 - Up to 99 questions

Why does the School District of Philadelphia participate?



- 1. To contribute to important research
- 2. To compare Philadelphia's results over time and to similar cities, Pennsylvania, and national results
- 3. To inform SDP's policies and programming
- 4. To justify funding requests and apply for grants to better address student needs

Examples of YRBS Data Use







Common Concerns with the YRBS

Won't asking about behaviors encourage students to engage in them?

No, CDC has conducted numerous studies and found no evidence of this.

How can we trust the results? Won't some students lie?

Research shows that students tell the truth on the YRBS.

Will some of these questions upset or trigger students?

Potentially, which is why we visit classrooms in person ahead of time to make students aware of what kinds of
questions the survey will ask, and work to provide supports should students need them (e.g., counselors,
resource sheets).

Why was there a delay with the release of the data?

- The Covid-19 pandemic delayed 2021 data collection. Typically, we conduct the YRBS in the spring semester. However, due to Covid-related school closures, we could not collect data until the fall semester in 2021.
- Additionally, there were significant Covid-related delays in data processing at CDC in 2022, so we did not receive our processed data in the typical time frame. However, we still believe these results are important to share.

- **1.5** Expand the Safe Path Program in partnership with foundations and city and state funders.
- **1.7** Identify, audit, and improve school climate programs.
- **1.8** Identify, audit, and improve mental and behavioral health services in partnership with the City of Philadelphia.
- **1.9** Recruit and retain certified school nurses for all schools to provide in-person or telehealth services depending on student need.
- **1.10** Implement Breakfast After the Bell at all schools and offer sufficient, healthy, and appetizing food during appropriate meal times to all students.
- **1.11** Implement recess supervised by trained staff and aligned to national best practices for all K-8 students.

The 2021 Philadelphia YRBS



1,351 participants from **30** randomly-selected School District of Philadelphia public high schools

99 questions on six topics:


- Unintentional Injuries & Violence
- Tobacco
- Alcohol and Drug Use
- Sexual Behaviors leading to HIV, STDs, or pregnancy
- Physical Activity & Dietary Behaviors
- Mental Health

Demographics: Philly YRBS sample, 2021




Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs)

- Adverse childhood experiences (ACEs) are potentially traumatic events that occur in childhood (0-17 years), as well as aspects of the child's environment that can undermine their sense of safety, stability, and bonding.
- According to the CDC, ACEs:
 - Are common
 - Are preventable
 - Have lasting, negative effects on health and well-being

High rates of ACEs in SDP students

According to the 2021 <u>Youth Risk Behavior Survey</u> (YRBS), the percentage of high school students who:





Ever had a parent or other adult in their home hit, beat, kick or physically hurt them in any way

Have ever seen someone get physically attacked, beaten, stabbed, or shot in their neighborhood

Ever had parents or other adults in their home slap, hit, kick, punch, or beat each other up

Reported that an adult or person at least 5 years older than them made them do sexual things they did not want to do






Physical Health:

Decrease in asthma, but increase in obesity


The YRBS asks students about their physical health, including questions about weight, dental health, asthma, and sleep, among others.



Nutrition: Higher self-reported rates of hunger for Asian, Black, and Hispanic students


The YRBS asks students about healthy behaviors, including hunger, consumption of breakfast, soda, fruits, and vegetables.

Percentage of students who were hungry sometimes, most of the time, or always because there was not enough food in their home, by race/ethnicity




Safety & Violence: Increase in self-report of carrying weapons on school property


The YRBS asks students about their experiences with bullying and physical violence.



Mental Health: Similar Trends for SDP, PA, US

The YRBS asks students about their mental health. The CDC describes mental health as "...an important part of overall health and well-being" that "affects how we think, feel, and act."






Mental Health:


Suicidal ideation continues to increase in SDP

The YRBS asks students about their mental health. The CDC describes mental health as "...an important part of overall health and well-being" that "affects how we think, feel, and act."




Mental Health: Higher rates of suicide attempts in SDP versus state and national

The YRBS asks students about their mental health. The CDC describes mental health as "...an important part of overall health and well-being" that "affects how we think, feel, and act."



Substance Use: Higher rates for Gay, Lesbian, and Bisexual students

The YRBS asks students about their experiences with substance use. Cigarette and alcohol use have decreased over the last decade. Use of electronic vapor products more than doubled from 2019 to 2021.



Sexual Health:

Only half of sexually active students used a condom

The YRBS asks students about current and past sexual behaviors, including having sexual intercourse, learning about contraception and HIV/STI testing, and using contraceptives and other preventive measures to practice safer sex.

Promoting Adolescent Student Health (PASH)

PASH is the HIV, STIs, and unintended pregnancy prevention program at the School District of Philadelphia.

- PASH efforts fall under three main components: 1) sexual health education, 2) sexual health services, and 3) safe and supportive environments.
- PASH provides access to evidence-based curriculum, technical assistance, workshops, and professional development to students, teachers, staff, and parents.
- Topics include HIV/AIDS prevention, safer sex, LGBTQ+ support, healthy relationships, parent/child communication, and peer mediation.

How does PASH use YRBS data?

- Creating dissemination materials for internal departments and various stakeholders
- Informing holistic approaches to promote healthy behaviors in schools across the city
- Guiding allocation of funds to areas of identified need
- Justifying grant funding requests
- Guiding programmatic planning both for PASH and at the school level



Efforts to support student health

- Providing professional development to targeted staff (counselors, nurses, teachers, athletic directors) to build capacity around sexual health curriculum, general health and inclusivity topics
- Health Resource Center (HRC) collaboration and expansion
- Social and emotional well-being initiatives, such as collaboration on the annual Gender and Sexual Health Summit and the development of the <u>All the Feels Journal</u> series
- Extensive collaboration with external community partner agencies




Efforts to support student health


- The Recess Working Group is focused on implementing recess for all students in grades K-8.
- <u>Eat Right Philly</u> helps students and families make healthy food choices.
- A <u>School District of Philadelphia</u> and <u>BenePhilly</u> partnership provides free, one-to-one benefits navigation and connects families to health insurance and food assistance.

- Because our sample is a representative sample of the District (not necessarily representative of each school), we cannot analyze results at the school level.
- However, the annual Philly School Experience Survey (PSES) asks students some of the same or similar questions, and data can complement each other.
