Richmond Elementary School will:

Provide a safe and supportive learning environment for students. The school will provide an education to every student aligned in the PA Common Core State Standards regardless of the levels and programs that the students are enrolled in (i.e. Special Education and ESOL). The school will provide access to interventions in literacy and math to support the academic levels of the students. Assessments will be given to students throughout the year to identify the strengths and weaknesses of students in their academic program.

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

Send our children to school every day and on time. Parents will ensure that students are dressed in school uniforms and come prepared each day with supplies for school. Report Card Conferences will be held November 18-20, 2020, February 3-5, 2021, and April 14-16, 2021. Other methods of communication will include: Homework, Attendance Letters, Parent Workshops, and Parent Portal, School Messenger, and Class Dojo. Parents may also receive phone calls, text messages, and emails regarding their children's learning. For students who are receiving additional supports and services, such as Special Education or ESOL, the parents will also receive communication from these teachers as well.
