Michael A. Davis, General Counsel, and Naomi Wyatt, Chief Talent Officer, provided an overview of the investigation of the occurrence of the hiring of a large number of School District employees without the approval of the School Reform Commission. Ms. Wyatt stated that about two months ago it was learned that a number of names were not appearing on the monthly personnel resolution. She stated that the report that was being run was not capturing all of the codes being used for hiring actions. The District has begun running a new report which captures seventeen (17) codes, as opposed to two (2) that were being used for previous reports. The personnel resolutions to be presented today, which include the October and November hires, include the seventeen codes. Ms. Wyatt stated that salary information has also been added to the personnel resolution. She stated that not only will the report capture the seventeen (17) codes, but staff will also review the reports at least twice. Ms. Wyatt stated that the problem appears to have existed since 2008, in which the District has been running the report using two codes. She stated that the District is in the process of running a report back through those years to capture employees who were not previously included on prior resolutions. Ms. Wyatt stated that though she does not know the exact number at this time, but it will be north of 5,000 – 7,000 employees that were not previously captured on the personnel reports between 2008 and 2013. Michael A. Davis, General Counsel, recommended that the District bring before the School Reform Commission a listing of those hires that were never included on a personnel resolution. He proposes that be done in January. Mr. Davis stated that one resolution would deal with personnel hires in December 2013 and a second resolution as a catch up resolution for those previously left off previous personnel resolutions. Mr. Davis stated that every personnel resolution brought before the School Reform Commission is in the form of a ratification resolution. In response to Commissioner Dworetzky's question about whether the reliability of the Position Control Report is impacted by the personnel resolution process, Ms. Wyatt stated that the personnel resolution is run off of personnel action codes and the Position Control Report is run off of different codes. It does not impact on the number of filled positions and the costs of those positions.

PHILADELPHIA INTERMEDIATE UNIT #26 MEETING OF THE SCHOOL REFORM COMMISSION PHILADELPHIA, PA

DECEMBER 19, 2013

A meeting of the School Reform Commission sitting as the Board of the Intermediate Unit was held on December 19, 2013 in the Auditorium of the School District of Philadelphia Education Center, 440 North Broad Street.

The meeting was convened at 5:00 p.m. by Dr. Pritchett, serving as Chairman Pro Tem.

Members present: Mr. Dworetzky, Ms. Houstoun, Dr. Pritchett, Ms. Simms – 4

Members absent: 0

The following resolutions were presented for formal action by the School Reform Commission:

IU-1

IDEA: \$1,099,332 Contracts with Camelot School (\$408,000); Community Council Education Services (\$379,691); NHS Woodhaven (\$311,641) – Alternative Special Education Settings

RESOLVED, that the School Reform Commission acting in its capacity as Board of Directors of the Philadelphia Intermediate Unit, authorizes Intermediate Unit #26, through the Acting Executive Director or his designee, to execute, deliver and perform contracts separately with Community Council Education Services for an amount not to exceed \$379,691, NHS Woodhaven for an amount not to exceed \$311,641, and Camelot Schools for an amount not to exceed \$408,000, for the full cost of alternative special education settings for children with severe disabilities, for a total amount not to exceed \$1,099,332, for the period commencing January 1, 2014 through June 30, 2014.

In response to Lisa Haver, Kim Caputo, Deputy Chief, Office of Specialized Services, confirmed that the amount is the same as what was requested for the first half of the school year. She also stated that there may be a slight variation with respect to Camelot, depending on the lease amount. Ms. Caputo also stated that the sites currently exist. In response to Commissioner Dworetzky's assertion of services provided by Community Council and Camelot roughly being the same category of services, Ms. Caputo stated that the RFP was for the provision of full time special education services for students with significant emotional disturbances. She stated that with respect to how the disability is described, there maybe some variations in terms of individual student presentation. Ms. Caputo stated that Community Council has a seat capacity of 60 and Camelot has a seat capacity of 46. She stated that the District pays a per student daily rate. The District does not pay for empty seats. Ms. Caputo stated that the students are placed through the IEP process. She stated that the rate for Camelot is \$88.69 and the rate for Community Council is \$69.44.The rate for Woodhaven is \$173.13, based on the complexity of the disability. In response to Commissioner Dworetzky, Ms. Caputo stated that Community Council currently has 49 students and Camelot has 30 students. She stated that the District attempts to make the placements first that are more cost beneficial, but that things like distance from the home may be an issue, or the student had a prior experience at a particular site. She also stated that they try to provide parents with a choice. Ms Caputo stated that seven vendors responded to the RFP. Four were not selected due to pricing.

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Categorical/Grant Fund: \$434,487 Contract with the Penn Center of Educational Leadership at the University of Pennsylvania – Coaching and Professional Development Services at Archdiocesan Schools RESOLVED, that the School Reform Commission acting in its capacity of the Board of Directors of the Philadelphia Intermediate Unit, authorizes Intermediate Unit #26, through the Executive Director or his designee, to execute, deliver and perform a contract with the Penn Center of Educational Leadership at the University of Pennsylvania, to provide professional development and coaching services at 15 Archdiocesan schools, for an amount not to exceed \$434,487, for the period commencing December 20, 2013 through June 30, 2014.

Dr. Pritchett stated that he would be abstaining on resolution IU-2, as his spouse is employed at University of Pennsylvania.

In response to Lisa Haver, Tara Feiner, Executive Director, Federal Programs, stated that various federal programs have an equitable services mandate.
