Overview of Revised Charter Application

- The Pennsylvania Charter School Law provides denied applicants with the right to appeal to the State Charter School Appeal Board or to resubmit a revised application
- The SRC is required to vote upon a revised application at the first scheduled public board meeting occurring at least 45 days after the receipt of the revised application

Resubmission Review

- KIPP's revised application for KIPP West Philadelphia Charter School was received by the Charter Schools Office on April 6, 2015
- District staff reviewed the content of the revised application and submitted an evaluation report to the SRC
- The SRC will vote upon the revised application this evening

PA Charter Law Requirements

- PA charter law contains guidelines for approval of charter applications, including:
 - The extent to which the application considers the information requested in the charter application
 - The capabilities of the applicant, in terms of support and planning, to provide comprehensive learning experiences to students
 - The demonstrated, sustainable support for the charter school plan by parents, community members, and students
 - The extent to which the charter school may serve as a model for other public schools

Young Scholars Frederick Douglass Charter School Charter Agreement Conditions

- The Board of Trustees agrees to enter into a management agreement with Mastery Charter High School (the Mastery Charter Schools management entity).
- The Board of Trustees shall be reconstituted by July 1, 2015.
- Board members of Douglass shall not also sit on the Board of Mastery Charter High School.
- The Board shall submit an amendment to the application to reflect any changes to curriculum, structure, or operations.
- Update admissions policy to provide that, if seats open during the year or between years, the school shall accept students from the waiting list or new applicants if no students on waiting list.
- Dates, times, and locations of Board meetings are posted on school's website and meeting minutes within two weeks of approval.
- 100% of core subject teaching staff are highly qualified.
