- Collaborating with the Philadelphia Police Department and other law enforcement agencies to support members of school communities who are victims of school-related crime;
- Conducting home visits with Officers and detectives/investigators to assist victims as needed;
- Providing criminal justice advocacy that may include court accompaniment and guidance with legal, financial, and medical systems;
- Providing guidance and assistance with victim compensation through the Victims' Compensation Assistance Program (VCAP);
- Providing referral for victims for services such as shelter, mental health treatment, medical care, transportation assistance and food vouchers;
- Maintaining a caseload of victims who are in need of short-term crisis intervention, emotional support, grief support groups, and appropriate referral sources for continued long-term needs;
- Working in conjunction with other Victim Services agencies to provide consultation and support to victims when needed.
