Sharswood School's GOALS:

Early Literacy: For every student group, at least 70% of Kindergarten and 50% 1st and 2nd grade students will score at target by the Spring AIMSWeb assessment.

Early Literacy: 100% of Kindergarten, 1st, and 2nd grade students will demonstrate one year of growth through a comparison of Q1 and Q4 independent reading levels.

Math: At least 25% of students will score at Proficient or Advanced on the Math PSSA

At least 75% of students will earn As and Bs in all core courses.

Climate 1: At least 60% of students will attend 95% or more of school days, and no more than 15% of students will attend less than 85% of days.
