Did you KNOW?

As we celebrate MLK Day of Service here's 5 facts that you might not already know...

- 1. <u>King's birth name was Michael, not Martin</u>: The civil rights leader was born Michael King Jr. on January 15, 1929. In 1934, however, his father, a pastor, traveled to Germany and became inspired by the Protestant Reformation leader Martin Luther. As a result, King Sr. changed his own name as well as that of his 5year-old son.
- He entered college at the age of 15: King was such a gifted student that he skipped grades nine and 12 before enrolling in 1944 at Morehouse College, the alma mater of his father and grandfather.
- 3. <u>3. King was imprisoned nearly 30 times</u>: He was arrested for acts of civil disobedience and even for driving 30 miles-per-hour in a 25 mile-per-hour zone.
- 4. <u>King's mother was also slain by a bullet:</u> While King's mother played the organ church, shots were fired, struck her, and she died steps from where her son had preached



nonviolence. The shooter life imprisonment, in part due to the King family's opposition to capital punishment.
<u>George Washington is the only other American to have had his birthday observed as a national holiday</u>: In 1983, President Reagan signed a bill that created a federal holiday to honor King. The holiday, first commemorated in 1986, is celebrated on the third Monday in January, close to the civil rights leader's January 15

birthday.
