you work with - are a very lucky group. Your hard work is noticed: Every. Single. Day.

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





# OUT OF THE ORDINARY TEACHER LEADER OPPORTUNITIES

Aside from the *typical* opportunities we highlight for teacher leaders. We wanted to pose a special "spotlight" on three very special opportunities.

### Academic Coach in the Office of Teaching & Learning

- Academic Coaches provide peer coaching and they support teachers rated Needs Improvement as well as second year teachers who were recommended for additional support by the PAR Panel. Coaching support is customized to meet the needs of the teacher and may include modeling, co-teaching, co-planning, data collection, and real-time feedback in the classroom. Academic Coaches engage with a variety of school-based stakeholders to support development of teachers on their caseload. Additionally, Academic Coaches are responsible for creating and designing data-driven Performance Improvement Plans (PIP).
- o Academic Coach positions in the Office of Teaching & Learning (Math)
- o Academic Coach positions in the Office of Teaching & Learning (ELA)
- Academic Coach positions in the Office of Teaching & Learning (K-12)

## Professional Learning Specialist in the Office of Teaching & Learning

- Professional Learning Specialists (PLS) design and deliver focused professional learning experiences for educators grounded in multiple opportunities for practice and feedback to support next-day implementation. Sessions integrate best practices of adult learning with follow up job-embedded coaching to support the application of the session's content. These supports include individualized coaching, data collection, modeling, co-teaching, and co-planning. PLSs also co-lead a district-wide professional development initiatives.
