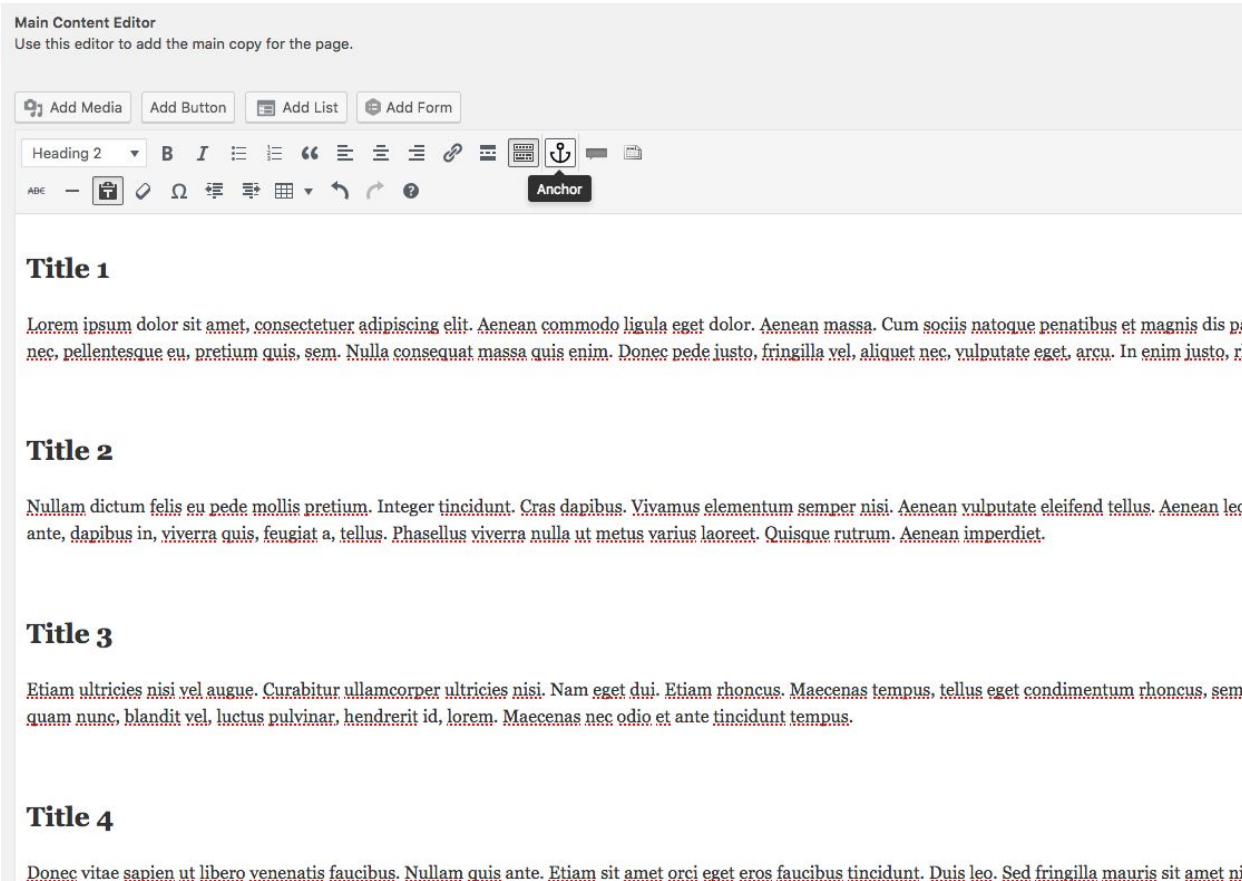


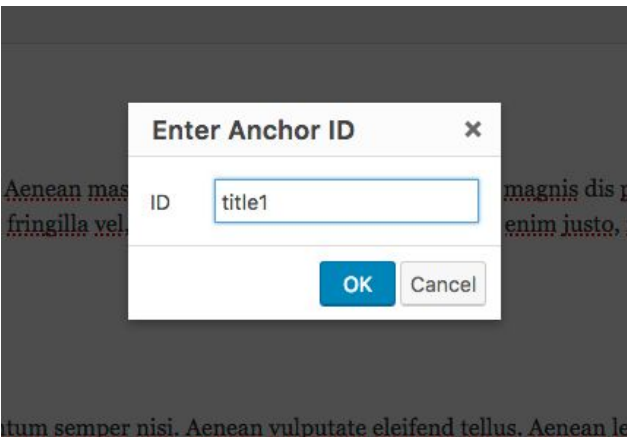
# Creating an Anchor Stepper

Anchor links act as a page jump, pointing to a specific section of page content.

1.) To add an anchor link, first navigate to the area within the Wordpress editor you'd like to add the link. Then click the "Anchor" button in the Wordpress editor to add the link.



2.) Add an ID for your anchor. Your ID should be named after the content you're linking to (e.g. title1).



3.) Click "OK" and an anchor shortcode will be automatically added to the editor. Note: The name will be added with hyphens for IDs with multiple words. Optionally, you can add a heading for this location on the page or place the anchor shortcode right above an existing header.

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4.) To link to the anchor on the page, create a text link as you might normally do to link to another webpage or website.





5.) Click the Insert/Edit link icon to add your link. Your link is the ID name with a # in front of it (e.g. #title1). Click on "Apply" (the blue button with the arrow inside it) to apply the link.

6.) Make sure to "Update" the page once the links and anchors has been set into place.

7.) View the changes on the page to verify that your anchor link works properly. Being logged in, the link may be directed to a location slightly lower on the page. This will not be the case for the users.

8.) To add more anchor links, follow the same steps as stated above. Make sure to give each anchor a unique ID. Also Be sure to test all of your anchor links to verify they are work correctly.
