#### JOINTLY DEVELOPED

The parents, students, and staff of Richard Wright Elementary School partnered together to develop this school-parent compact for achievement. For the upcoming school year the School's Goals as aligned to the District's goals are as follows:

1. At least 60% of students will attend school 95% of days or more.

- 2. At least 70% of Kindergarten students and 50% of 1st and 2nd grade students will score at target by the Spring aimswebPlus assessment.
- 3. At least 36% of students will score at Proficient or Advanced on the ELA PSSA.
- 4. At least 24% of students will score at Proficient or Advanced on the Math PSSA.

- Deliver the consistent message of school as a priority.
- Work to secure a quiet supportive environment for students to work in at home.
- Work to ensure that children attend school on a regular basis, missing no more than 9 school days annually.
- Work to ensure children adhere to school rules.
