The parents, students and staff of Woodrow Wilson Middle School partnered together to develop this school-parent compact for achievement. Grade 8: No more than 10% of students will score below basic on reading PSSA No more than 50% of students will score below basic on math PSSA

SCHOOL/TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES:

Woodrow Wilson Middle School expects the school and teachers to maintain certain responsibilities in order to ensure every student has access to a positive and equitable educational experience in a number of ways.. First, the school and teacher will closely monitor student attendance. Second, the school and teachers will provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the state's student academic achievement standards. Third, the school and teachers will provide feedback on student progress through the means of quarterly parent-teacher conferences and progress reports. Fourth, the school and teachers will provide parents reasonable access to staff. Finally, the school and teachers will provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's trips.

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

Woodrow Wilson Middle School expects the parents to maintain certain responsibilities in order to ensure that every student has access to a positive and equitable educational experience in a number of ways. First, the parents are expected to monitor consistent student attendance. Second, parents are expected to monitor their child's participation in school as they complete homework assignments and participate in the curriculum that the school and teachers have created. Third, parents are expected to reflect on the feedback given by the school and teachers in order to support their child(ren) in obtaining academic proficiency. Fourth, parents are expected to reach out to staff with any concerns or questions throughout the school year. Finally, parents are expected to maintain a general interest in the experiences of their child(ren) at school.

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

Woodrow Wilson Middle School expects the students to maintain certain responsibilities in order to ensure that each of them has access to a positive and equitable educational experience in a number of ways. First, students are expected to attend school regularly and consistently. Second, students are expected to complete all assignments given to them by their teachers and engage completely in the curriculum. Third, students are expected to reflect and act on the feedback given to them by staff members in order to obtain academic proficiency. Fourth, students are expected to reach out to staff members with any concerns or questions. Finally, students are expected to communicate school notices and information between school staff and parents regularly.

COMMUNICATION ABOUT STUDENT LEARNING:

Woodrow Wilson Middle School is committed to frequent two-way communication with families about children's learning. Some of the ways you can expect us to reach you are, student agenda book communication log, phone calls, emails, postings on the website, progress reports, conferences and monthly newsletters.
